THE HONORABLE RICHARD GREEN LUGAR

The Honorable Richard Green Lugar, Mayor of Indianapolis, Indiana's capitol, will give the 1972 commencement keynote address.

Mayor of Indianapolis since 1968, Richard G. Lugar has earned outstanding merits in the areas of academics, business and government. His masterful campaign for the consolidation of the Indianapolis and Marion County governments was an important accomplishment for him as Mayor of Indianapolis.

Through his work, Mayor Lugar and Indianapolis have gained national prominence. A sampling of his achievements include serving on President Nixon's Urban Affairs Council, and at Nixon's behest, Mayor Lugar represented the cities of the United States at a meeting of the North Atlantic Treaty Organization's Committee on the Challenges of Modern Society.

Mayor Lugar is a fourth-generation Hoosier who graduated first in his 600 student high school class, then duplicated this effort at Denison University in Ohio. He became Denison's first undergraduate to receive a Rhodes Scholarship. At Oxford, he received two degrees, served as president of the 250-man American Students Association, and, although he was the only American enrolled, was elected president of the student body at Pembroke College. In 1957, he attended U. S. Navy Officers Candidate School, and during most of his three years of active duty, served as intelligence briefer for Admiral Arleigh A. Burke, then Chief of Naval Operations.

Mayor Lugar, after returning to Indianapolis in 1960, rebuilt two family enterprises, one a 604 acre farm, the other a producer of automated food machinery.

Mayor Lugar attributes his mayorial success to his business finesse, to the city's potential, to miraculous business management and to a general theme of excellence.

Youthful Mayor Lugar is an avid supporter of students in government. He meets informally with students for a frank exchange of opinions.

He serves higher education as a member of the Board of Trustees of both Denison University and Indiana Central College.

The degree of Doctor of Civil Law will be conferred upon Richard Green Lugar who has served his state and his country in excellent dimensions.

Indiana State University, Evansville

The Evansville Campus of Indiana State University, was established in 1965 as a public higher education facility in South-western Indiana.

Academic programs leading to a four-year baccalaureate degree are offered in Business, Humanities, Sciences, Social Sciences and Education, in addition to associate degrees in the areas of Respiratory Therapy, Dental Hygiene, Office Administration, Science, and Social Science. The Class of 1972 is the second class graduated from the Evansville Campus.

Located in the rolling hills of the 1500 acre Mid-America University Center, Indiana State University, Evansville, is developing into a campus with a promising future as an integral part of public higher education in the State of Indiana. Students from 32 Indiana counties enrolled at ISUE in September, 1971. The campus serves persons in the Evansville area and surrounding communities and is conveniently situated midway between Evansville and Mt. Vernon metropolitan areas on Highway 62.

Community support has been vital to the growth of the Evansville Campus. The campus has been assisted in its development by the advice, counsel, and support of Southern Indiana Higher Education, Inc., the Evansville Campus Advisory Board, and the Evansville Campus Foundation, as well as a very interested and concerned community as a whole. The Evansville Campus Foundation has a Board of Directors of thirty members, and with the cooperation of the Evansville Jaycees has successfully promoted a Book Club program to purchase books for the university library. Another project, the Foundation Century Club, is composed of more than 200 members who contribute unrestricted funds for campus development.
