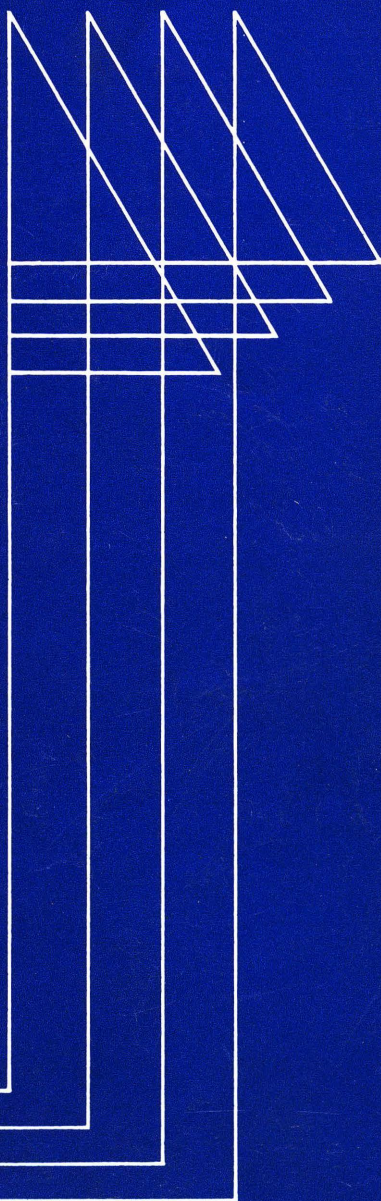

Governor Robert D. Orr

Will Bring Commencement Address

The Commencement Address today will be delivered by the Honorable Robert Dunkerson Orr, whose two terms as Indiana's chief executive have been characterized by a commitment to improving education throughout the state.

Governor Orr has initiated many educational reforms, including the PRIME TIME program to reduce class size in the early elementary grades, programs for gifted and talented children, an incentive pay program for teachers, and a mandatory competency testing and remediation program.

Governor Orr guided legislation which created a Board of Incorporators for a Separate State University in Southwestern Indiana in 1984 and challenged that Board to prepare the way for the new institution. The following year, with his guidance, the legislation was passed which established the University of Southern Indiana. The bill became law when it was signed by Governor Orr at USI on April 16, 1985.

The Governor is a member of the steering committee of the Education Commission of the States, and recently was asked to serve on U.S. Department of Education Secretary William Bennett's Study Group on Elementary Education. He is the only governor on the committee.

A 1940 graduate of Yale University, Governor Orr attended Harvard Graduate School of Business before the outbreak of World War II. He served in the United States Army in the Pacific Theater of Operations, rising from private to major. He received the Legion of Merit for his outstanding service. When he returned to the United States, he married his college sweetheart, Joanne Wallace.

Governor Orr is a sixth-generation Hoosier and a native of Evansville, where he was a business, civic, and political leader. Following military service, he went to work at the family-owned Orr Iron Company and also entered a career of public service. Governor Orr was one of a group of business and civic leaders who formed Evansville's Future, Inc., an organization which sought to overcome regional economic adversity in the late 1950s. He was an active member of numerous community organizations and pursued his political interests in Republican Party positions, including precinct committeeman and county chairman. Governor Orr won his first general election in 1950 when he became a member of the Center Township Advisory Board. He was first elected to the State Senate in 1968 and served in that capacity until becoming lieutenant governor in 1972. After serving two terms, he was elected Indiana's 45th governor by a record margin in 1980. Governor Orr was re-elected in 1984.

Governor Orr has continued his interest in business and industry. He is a former chairman of Indian Industries, Inc., in Evansville, which manufactures recreational products, and still serves on the Board of Dixson, Inc., of Grand Junction, Colorado.

Governor Orr is president of the Council of State Governments and chairman of the National Governors Association Transportation and Commerce Committee. By appointment of President Reagan, he is a member of the Amtrak Board of Directors, representing all governors.

Honored For Cultural Contributions

Mrs. Joanne Wallace Orr, Indiana's First Lady, has combined a love of the outdoors and the arts into a life of service to her community. Her interests include all visual and performing arts, cooking, needlework, gardening, sports, historic preservation, and helping senior citizens become foster grandparents.

A native of Massachusetts, Mrs. Orr moved to Indiana in 1946, two years after her marriage to Robert Dunkerson Orr. The Orrs have three children and four grandchildren. She is a home economics graduate of Finch Junior College in New York City and also was graduated from secretarial school. Following college, she was accepted into the Women's Air Force Service Pilots program in Sweetwater, Texas. She was assigned for two and one half years to the Air Force Ferry Command, flying bombers and pursuit and cargo planes during World War II. She currently holds a commercial pilot's license and is authorized to fly multi-engine unlimited horsepower aircraft. She also was one of the first Red Cross nurse's aides in the United States, working in the three major hospitals in Springfield, Massachusetts.

Mrs. Orr's encouragement of the arts developed while she was in Evansville, working with such groups as the Philharmonic Orchestra, Evansville Museum of Arts and Science, and the Evansville Arts and Education Council. She helped initiate the Ohio River Arts Festival and the Artists at the Zoo program. She also was instrumental in starting the Indiana Arts Commission in 1967, while her husband was a State Senator. At that same time, she initiated an effort to hang paintings in legislative meeting rooms at the Statehouse, personally transporting eight from the Evansville Museum to Indianapolis to start the exhibit. Indiana law requires that oil paintings be made of Hoosier governors, but Mrs. Orr found they had been retired to the Statehouse attic. She has had them retrieved, restored, and returned to Statehouse walls.

In 1976, Mrs. Orr combined her interests in cooking and historic preservation into a fascinating cookbook titled "The Kenmore Kitchen Directory," to help raise money for Kenmore Manor in Fredericksburg, Virginia, where she serves on the board. The cookbook, featuring several of Mrs. Orr's own recipes, was inspired by the manor house built by Fielding Lewis in 1750 for Betty Washington, George Washington's only sister. Today, it is one of the country's most acclaimed national historic landmarks.

Since Mrs. Orr's arrival at the Governor's Residence in January, 1981, many changes have been effected. Under her direction, fine antiques, paintings, sculpture, and accessories have been added to enhance the residence. The "Hoosier Heritage Garden" has been developed, with the many new varieties of flowers adding vibrant color for the numerous summer tent functions. During Mrs. Orr's tenancy, the house has been open to more statewide organizations than almost any other governor's residence in the country.

Mrs. Orr serves on the boards of the Indianapolis Symphony Orchestra, Conner Prairie Settlement, and the Historic Landmarks Association. She also holds membership in the Indiana Arts Commission, Oriental Arts Society, Indiana Advocates for the Arts, Decorative Arts Trust, Indianapolis Museum of Art, Embroiderers' Guild, National Trust for Historic Preservation, Family Support Center, Welfare Service League, State Assembly Women's Club, and Planned Parenthood.

Dr. Margery Wayne Shaw's

Contributions

To Medicine And Law

Will Be Recognized



Dr. Margery Wayne Shaw is in the forefront of the nation's medical and legal experts who are called upon to examine and formulate public policy on medical and health issues. She is respected nationwide for her work in the legal and medical ramifications of genetics research and recently became involved in the public policy debate over Acquired Immune Deficiency Syndrome (AIDS).

An Evansville native, Dr. Shaw attended Hanover College and graduated magna cum laude from the University of Alabama in 1945. A year later, she was awarded the Master of Arts degree from Columbia University. In 1957, Dr. Shaw earned the M.D. degree with honors from the University of Michigan, and for nine years, taught in the Department of Human Genetics at the University of Michigan Medical School, advancing from instructor to associate professor. She joined the faculty of the University of Texas Graduate school of Biomedical Sciences at Houston in 1967 and also became affiliated as an associate biologist with the M.D. Anderson Hospital and Tumor Institute there. Four years later, Dr. Shaw was named director of the Medical Genetics Center.

In the late sixties and early seventies, it became apparent that law, medicine, and ethics were inextricably linked. The rapidly changing field of genetics, in which Dr. Shaw's research was focused, was one of the first to experience conflict between medical advances and legal issues. Dr. Shaw undertook the study of law at the University of Houston and in 1973 was awarded the Juris Doctor degree. Combining her expertise in both medicine and law, Dr. Shaw spent the next year as a visiting scholar in the Yale University Law School and as visiting professor of medical genetics in Yale's Medical School. She has accepted many appointments at the University of Texas, including acting dean of the Graduate School of Biomedical Sciences, director of the Health Law Program of the Health Science Center, and professor of community medicine. She currently is professor and senior scholar in the Health Law Program and professor of health law in the School of Public Health. Although her primary assignments have been at the University of Texas, she has been a visiting professor at the University of North Carolina and the University of Utah Medical Center.

While she was at Utah, medical history was made with the first implant of an artificial heart. Dr. Shaw regularly met with Dr. William DeVries, Dr. Robert K. Jarvik, and the medical staff to discuss the legal, ethical, and public policy issues which resulted. Dr. Shaw later wrote a book based on proceedings of conference about the heart implant of Dr. Barney Clark.

In the past few months, Dr. Shaw's energies have been directed to public policy formulation on AIDS. As a member of a Steering Committee of the National Academy of Science, she has traveled extensively in the United States, conducting hearings and gathering testimony from all segments of society. The committee's report, due the end of July, will go to Congress and the President.

Dr. Shaw is the only woman to serve as president of both the American Society of Human Genetics and the Genetics Society of America. She also has been a member of the board of the American Society of Law and Medicine, the Biological Science Curriculum Study, the Center for Education in Human and Medical Genetics, and the National Genetics Foundation.

Academic Dress

The academic costume dates from medieval days when university students wore woolen and fur garments for warmth in damp and drafty buildings. Most of those studying were clerics in the holy orders; they wore a cloak to which was attached a hood that could be pulled up to cover their tonsured heads. Simplified today, the costume serves to remind us that its wearer is a member of an ancient and venerable profession; it also indicates by its color and design its wearer's degree and its institution by which the degree was conferred.

In the United States, black has been the traditional color for academic gowns, but some institutions authorize holders of their doctorates to wear colors of the institution. The bachelor's gown is distinguished by its long, open sleeves; the master's by its closed, slitted sleeves; the doctor's by its full sleeves trimmed with bands of velvet, which may be black or a color denoting the field in which the degree was taken.

The mortarboard cap, proper for all degrees, is black. Tassels, usually black, are worn over the left front quarter of the cap. Holders of the doctorate may wear tassels of gold thread.

Academic hoods vary in length according to the degree and are lined with the colors of the institution by which the degree was granted. The honorary doctoral hoods of the University of Southern Indiana are black, lined with blue satin with red satin chevrons. They are edged with white velvet.

The Mace of the University

In medieval England, the mace was a formidable weapon, held ready by a bodyguard who led the way for dignitaries or officers of the court. From the sixteenth century in England and since colonial days in America, the mace has become a symbol of office only, and is carried by a distinguished member of the faculty who leads the Commencement processional. Here, it is carried by the Grand Marshal.

The University's official Mace is the cane of Richard Owen, who was a geologist and professor of natural science at Indiana University before becoming the first president of Purdue University. A respected scientist and scholar, Richard was a son of Robert Owen, the Scottish industrialist who established New Harmony, Indiana as a center for education and enlightened social reform in the early 1800s. All the children of Robert Owen who accompanied him to America made far-reaching contributions to society, and helped to shape the governmental, social, and cultural directions of the state, region, and nation.

Scholarship Honors

The student graduating with the highest scholarship index will be graduated *summa cum laude*. Students graduating with a scholarship index of 3.80 or higher will be graduated *magna cum laude*. Those with a scholarship index between 3.60 and 3.80 will be graduated *cum laude*. These achievements are set forth on the individual diplomas. Honor students can be recognized in the commencement exercises by the colored stoles and tassels. Gold indicates *summa cum laude*; red, *magna cum laude*; and blue, *cum laude*.
