EDUCATION: I graduated from (1) University of Evansville, Evansville, Indiana, (2) University of Denver, College of Law, Denver, Colorado. (Dissertation: Rights of the Individual Person Before the International Court of Justice), and (3) Reppert School of Auctioneering, Decatur, Indiana;

CONSULTING: I do consulting for businesses in helping owners/managers to prepare and implement business plans, cash flow analysis, increase profitability, control costs, international marketing, and governmental relations.

BUSINESS EXPERIENCE:

I grew up in our family food and feed business, where I was involved in most phases of the business. After law school, I was an attorney (judge advocate) in the United States Air Force for six years. Immediately thereafter, I was a lawyer and manager for the Navajo Tribe of Indians, as well as the Administrator for the Navajo Agricultural Products Industry (Navajo Indian Irrigation Project), and I have been in private law practice, business and a university professor through the present. I am a pilot with a commercial license with flight instructor and instrument ratings for single engine and multi-engine ratings.

I have considerable experience in international business relations and law, having worked in these areas in Vietnam, Germany and Mexico.

I practiced law in New Mexico, and on the Navajo Indian Reservation. I was also in private law practice in eastern Colorado, where, in addition to practicing law, I was a deputy district attorney and municipal judge.

As Administrator with the Navajos, my responsibilities included:

- (A) negotiating and drafting all purchase contracts for equipment, supplies, materials, etc.
- (B) training of all personnel in all jobs required on the project - farm laborers, irrigators, planners, agronomists, marketers, police, fire, mechanics, etc.
- (C) planning all agribusinesses such as sprinkler irrigation sales, seed production, livestock feedlots, etc.
- (D) operation of a 10,000 head sheep feedlot.

(E) operation of a 1,500 head cattle feedlot.

(F) construction of a town.

(G) establishment of a school, fire department, police department, emergency care medical facilities, and ambulance service, headquarters facilities (with barns, offices, assembly buildings, etc. and other infrastructure.

(H) research and development

(I) working with the Rockefeller Foundations (Winrock International Livestock Research and Training Foundation, Petit Jean Mountain, Arkansas) for improvement of the Navajo sheep and developing of a new breed of sheep adaptable to the Navajo desert terrain.

(J) application for loans and grants from various private and governmental agencies.

(K) coordination of the efforts and negotiating settlements and compromises between the myriad governmental agencies and departments (Bureau of Indian Affairs, Bureau of Reclamation, Department of Labor, Department of Agriculture, Department of Commerce, drafting of the Environmental Impact Statement, and on and on) for the federal, state and Navajo tribal governments, as well as the offices of the governors of Arizona, New Mexico, and Utah.

(L) marketing all agricultural products raised and produced on the entire irrigation project.

INTERNATIONAL RELATIONS:

My area of emphasis in law school was in the field of International Law. I did my dissertation for my juris doctorate on the rights of an individual before the International Court of Justice in The Hague, Netherlands. As described briefly in the section regarding my Air Force service, I was involved extensively in international relations in Vietnam and Germany. This included not only negotiations regarding Americans in trouble in those countries, but also business relationships. As the lawyer responsible for government contracting at each of the three air bases where I served, I had numerous dealings with foreign businesses doing and desiring to do business with the United States Air Force. This involved domestic as well as foreign laws and administrative procedures, import and export of American goods into and out of those countries, claims and local property matters, and local social customs and procedures, international transportation, etc. In each country, this related to some very sensitive matters which affected our and their national interests. A number of these matters were handled at some of the highest levels.

I have taken part in detailed business negotiations in Mexico at the highest levels; meeting with members of Mexican businesses, the Mexican Congress, and a representative of the

President of Mexico. I prepared a detailed business plan to take a rodeo to Russia, working with the United States Embassy and the Russian Ministry of Culture, both in Moscow. This effort required planning and working out the details for international travel, including customs, health requirements, bringing of medications into other countries, arrangements for transportation, food, lodging, repairs, etc. Then, I negotiated sponsorships, etc. with various European and American companies.

I have obtained import permits and licenses for American companies to bring into the United States items manufactured and processed in Mexico.

HONORS:

In the Fall, 2006, I received the Excellence in the Entrepreneurship Classroom Teaching Award at the Experiential Classroom VII Entrepreneurship Program held at Syracuse University.

I have twice received the Excellence in Teaching Award, presented by the Faculty of the School of Business of the University of Southern Indiana.

I have received the “Best Paper Award” three times at various conferences where I have presented papers I have written or co-written.

The Governor of the State of New Mexico designated me a Juez Commissionado.

The Governor of the State of Colorado appointed me as a member of a commission recommending to him new judges for him to appoint as vacancies occurred.
