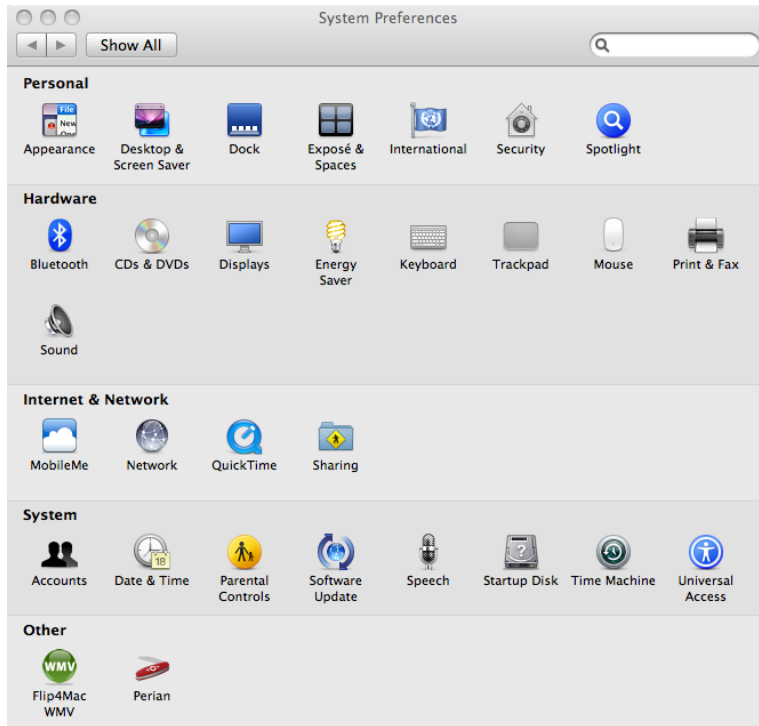
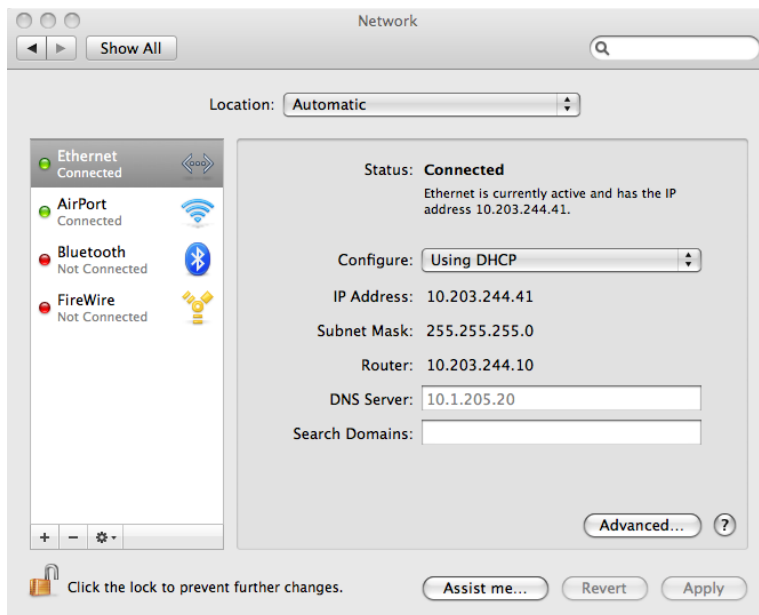


Open the System Preferences either by clicking the Apple menu at the top-left side of the screen or the System Preferences icon on the task bar at the bottom of the screen. Once it is open, click on Network.



You should see a list similar to the screenshot below. On the left, choose Ethernet and make sure it is set to use DHCP. You should see a set of numbers similar to what you see below (they will NOT be identical to the numbers listed here).



Test your internet connection by opening your web browser and going to a page you have never been to before (<http://www.ibm.com> for example). If it is active and working, you are done! If not, follow along...

If you click on the advanced button, you will get a screen similar to the one below. Make sure that all the setting on all the tabs (TCP/IP, DNS, WINS, etc...) are all set to their default values. AppleTalk should NOT be enabled. For the IPv6 setting, automatic should work, but for testing purposes it can be set to Disabled. If this fixes your internet connection, it can be left disabled.
