What is Parish/Faith Community Nursing?

Parish/Faith Community Nursing is a unique, specialized practice of professional nursing which focuses on the promotion of health and wholeness within the context of the values, beliefs, and practices of a faith community. The Parish/Faith Community Nurse functions as:

- Health educator promoting wellness
- Health counselor advocating personal responsibility
- Teacher and coordinator of volunteers
- Liaison with community resources
- Integrator of faith and health

Program Description

This program will prepare nurses to work or volunteer in the faith community nursing role. The program is focused on the development of the knowledge, attitudes, and skills central to the parish/faith community nurse role. Participants will learn from experienced parish nurses, clergy, and nursing faculty about the various functions of the parish/faith community nurse. The curriculum of this program is the standardized core curricula developed through the International Parish Nurse Resource Center, in consultation with the National League for Nursing (NLN) and the American Nurses Association (ANA) Credentialing Center.

Program Objectives

At the close of the program, the participant will:

- Identify strategies for integrating concepts of faith and health in the parish/faith community nurse role
- Demonstrate knowledge, attitude, and skills to practice as a beginning parish/faith community nurse
- Identify a network for continuing development and support
- Identify ways to nurture personal spiritual development

Target Audience

This program is designed for registered nurses and students enrolled in a baccalaureate degree program who are interested in working or volunteering in a faith community nursing role.

Cost: \$600

A deposit of \$100 is due by August 17; balance is payable by September 9. Registration is limited. Registration fee, less \$50, is refundable until September 15. Cost includes materials, 12 meals, and Wednesday through Saturday night double-occupancy lodging accommodations. For single occupancy, if available, add \$20 per night.

Grant Opportunity

Nurses from churches in Dubois, Gibson, Perry, Pike, Posey, Spencer, Vanderburgh, and Warrick Counties in Indiana, Henderson County in Kentucky, and Gallatin, Saline, Wabash, Wayne, and White in Illinois, may be eligible for a grant of \$450 toward the cost of attending the course from the Welborn Baptist Foundation.
