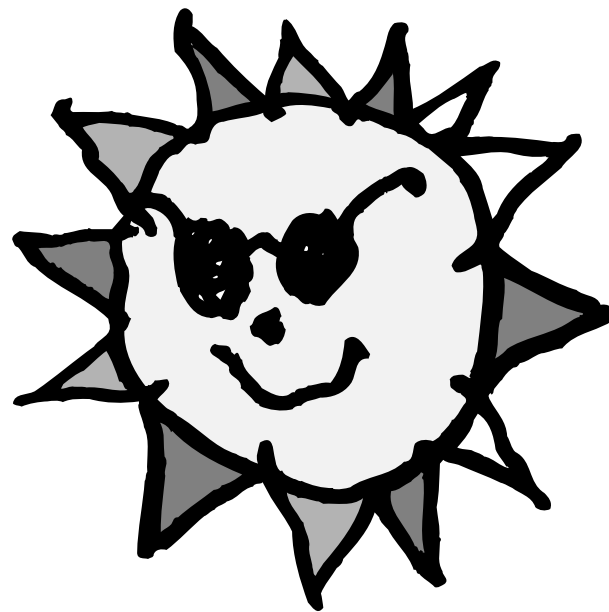
## **SUPER SUMMER**

Super Summer will look a little different this year, as we collaborate with the Evansville-Vanderburgh School Corporation (EVSC) to “connect” USI’s Super Summer with a federal grant EVSC has been awarded to support teaching and learning science. This grant will partially subsidize the morning Super Summer science classes for children entering grades 1–8, allowing USI to offer Super Summer classes at a reduced rate. The morning science classes are only \$35 per course and the afternoon enrichment classes are \$75, less than past summers’ class fees. Although the morning preK–K class is not affiliated with the grant, the \$35 fee will still be honored. **ENROLL EARLY—CLASSES FILL QUICKLY!**

Super Summer consists of two one-week sessions, held June 8–12 and July 6–10. Children from preschool to ninth grade can enroll in either morning classes from 9–11:30 a.m., afternoon classes from 12:30–3 p.m., or stay all day. Morning classes for grades 1–8 are based on the premise that students learn science best by doing science and use inquiry-centered modules. Each science-themed module contains materials and activities that engage students in enduring experiences that lead to a deeper understanding of the natural world. Although the morning class themes for grades 1–8 are repeated in weeks one and two, many of the activities will vary. Afternoon classes for all grades focus on art, forensics, robotics, world cultures, technology, and more. **Grades referred to are the grades children will enter this fall.**

Free lunchtime supervision is available at each location for those enrolling in both morning and afternoon classes. Students staying for lunch should bring their own non-perishable lunches and drinks.
