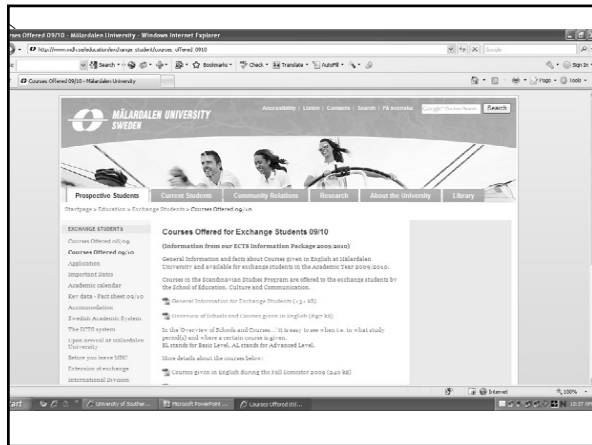
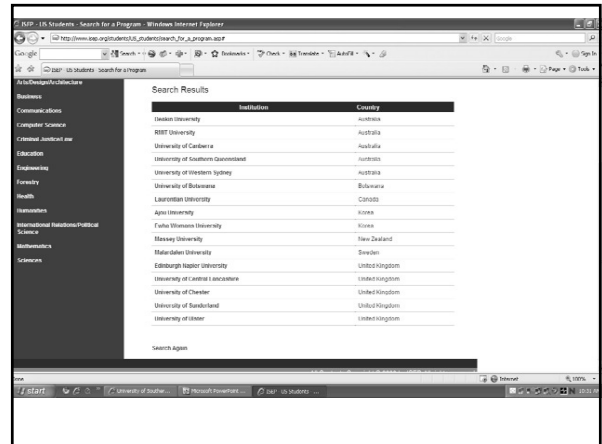
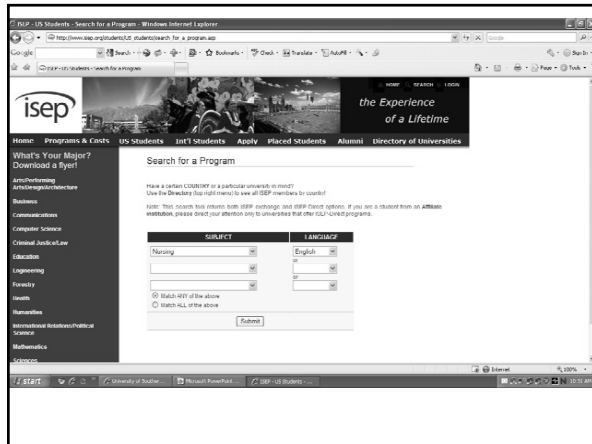
- A network of institutions around the world

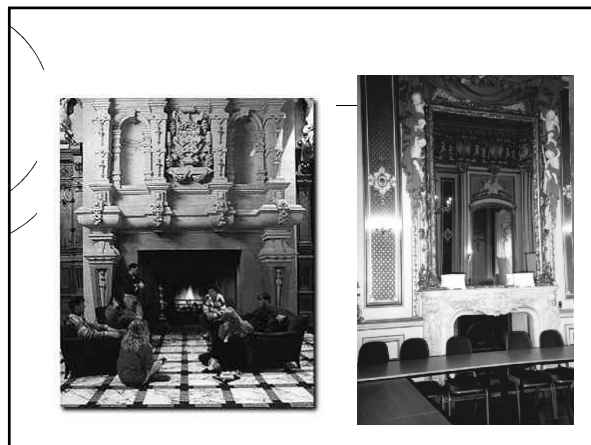

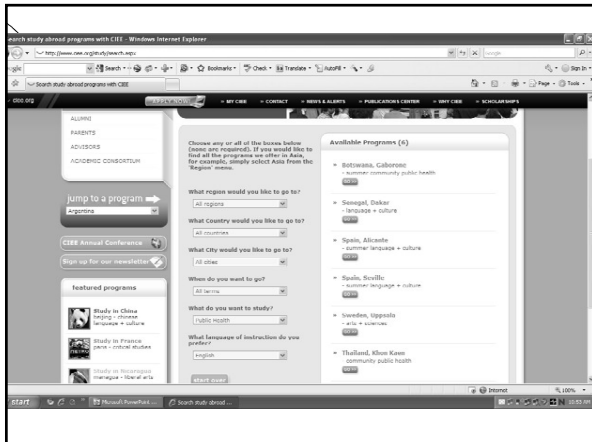

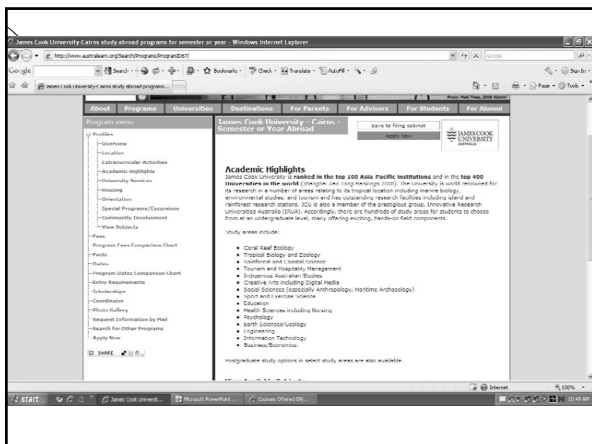

Continues to influence interactions with people from different cultures	94%







