



University of Southern Indiana Art Program announces the Sol and Arlene Bronstein Art Scholarships for two incoming freshman art students. Each scholarship is worth \$4,000 (\$1,000 a year for 4 years).

What is the Sol and Arlene Bronstein Art Scholarship?

This scholarship is awarded to an incoming freshman art major. It is valued at \$1,000 per academic year (fall and spring semester) and may be applied to student fees, tuition, and books.

Is the scholarships renewable?

This scholarship is renewable for a maximum of three additional years or until 124 credit hours are attempted, whichever comes first.

In order to continue this scholarship the student must maintain a cumulative grade point average of 3.0 (on a 4.0 point scale), remain an art or art education major, and continue to demonstrate creative artistic growth.

Can the scholarships be canceled?

This scholarship can be cancelled and not reinstated if renewal criteria are not met. Minimum enrollment standards will be evaluated each semester. The student's cumulative grade point average and artistic growth will be reviewed at the end of each spring semester.

Who is eligible?

Candidates must meet the following conditions

- Incoming USI art or art education major
- 3.0 high school grade point average (on a 4.0 point scale)
- Submit a slide, photo, or CD portfolio of art work (8-10 pieces)
- Complete and submit an application form

When is the deadline?

The application and other materials are due by the last Monday in February.
