### **CONSTRUCTION COMMITTEE**

### UNIVERSITY OF SOUTHERN INDIANA BOARD OF TRUSTEES

April 16, 2001

The Construction Committee of the University of Southern Indiana Board of Trustees met on April 16, 2001, in Room 100 of the Wright Administration Building. In attendance were Trustees Tina Kern, David Huber, and Jim Will; Vice President for Business Affairs Richard Schmidt; Associate Vice President for Fiscal and Physical Affairs Robert Ruble; Director of Facilities Operations and Planning Steve Helfrich; and Director of Procurement and Distribution Services David Goldenberg. Trustee Patrick Hoehn attended via conference call. Also in attendance was Mike Buente of Buente-Buente Architects, representing the firm of Veazey, Parrott, Durkin, and Shoulders.

There being a quorum present, Chair Tina Kern called the meeting to order at 11:00 a.m.

# 1. REVIEW AND APPROVAL OF FINAL DESIGN PLAN FOR THE UNIVERSITY CENTER EXPANSION PROJECT

Mr. Buente described the project, which includes relocating the existing Multicultural Center to make room for expanded seating in the dining area, relocating the food service offices, constructing new walk-in coolers and freezers, expanding the bookstore retail and textbook space, constructing new bookstore offices, reworking the banking center, and constructing a new reception desk. An overall concept drawing is attached (Attachment B). Mr. Buente reported that the work would be done in two phases and that the project would be substantially complete by July 23, 2001.

On a motion by Mr. Will, seconded by Mr. Huber, the committee <u>approved</u> the final design plan for the University Center Expansion Project.

## 2. REVIEW AND APPROVAL OF CONSTRUCTION BIDS FOR THE UNIVERSITY CENTER EXPANSION PROJECT

Mr. Ruble reviewed the Bid Tabulation Sheet (Attachment C). In response to questions regarding the project schedule, Mr. Buente reported that the proposed contractors are prepared to keep the project on schedule and understand the necessity for completion of the project as planned.

Following discussion, on a motion by Mr. Will, seconded by Mr. Huber, the committee <u>approved</u> the low bid submitted by Lichtenberger Construction Company.

There being no further business, the meeting adjourned at 11:35 a.m.

## University Center Expansion Project

April 11, 2001

At its January 1, 2001 meeting, the Trustees authorized staff to proceed with the renovation of a portion of the University Center, including engaging an architect, and authorized the Construction Committee to act on the Trustees' behalf concerning design approval and contract execution for this project.

Renovation costs were estimated at \$550,000.

Since that time, the University has engaged the architectural firm of Veazey, Parrot, Durkin & Shoulders to design and manage the project.

The project consists of relocating the existing Multicultural Center to make room for expanded seating in the dining area, relocating the food service offices, constructing new walk-in coolers and freezers, expanding the bookstore retail and textbook space, constructing new bookstore offices, reworking the banking center, and constructing a new reception desk.

An overall concept drawing of the Eagles Nest area is attached to this page, and detailed construction drawings are available for review.


Construction bids were received on April 10, 2001. Eight contractors bid on the project, with bids ranging from a high of \$485,165 to a low of \$400,896. Lichtenberger Construction Company submitted the low bid. Veazey, Parrot, Durkin & Shoulders and the University recommend accepting that low bid.

With the approval of the Construction Committee, the University will execute a construction contract for \$400,896 with Lichtenberger Construction Company.

Architectural fees and a contingency amount bring the total renovation cost to the anticipated \$550,000, as follows:

\$400,896 Lichtenberger Construction Company 80,000 Architectural Fees Estimated Maximum 69,104 Contingency for Unexpected Expenses \$550,000 Total

Staff now seek authority from the Construction Committee to execute the necessary contract for \$400,896 with Lichtenberger Construction Company.
