MINUTES

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May 12, 1989

The University of Southern Indiana Board of Trustees met Friday, May 12, 1989, in the University Center. Present were Trustees Robert M. Boyer, William E. Brooks, Jr., Percy Clark, Jr., Robert J. Fair, J. Patrick Leahy, Joseph E. O'Daniel, John J Pruis, Carole D. Rust, and George B. Weathersby. Also attending were President David L. Rice; Vice Presidents Donald Bennett, Robert Reid, Sherrianne Standley, and Byron Wright; Faculty Senate Chairperson Larry Goss; and Student Government Association President Paula Byassee.

There being a quorum present, Mr. Fair called the meeting to order at 4:00 p.m.

SECTION I - GENERAL AND ACADEMIC MATTERS

A. APPROVAL OF MINUTES OF MARCH 2, 1989, MEETING

On a motion by Dr. Pruis, seconded by Dr. Weathersby, the minutes of the March 2, 1989, meeting were approved.

B. ESTABLISHMENT OF NEXT MEETING DATE, TIME, LOCATION

The next regular meeting of the Board of Trustees was set for Saturday, July 1, 1989, in New Harmony, Indiana.

C. PRESIDENT'S REPORT

Dr. Rice reported that the University will confer degrees on over 600 students at Commencement Exercises the next day. Also, honorary degrees will be conferred on three outstanding individuals--Carolyn Sue Georgette, Lee H. Hamilton, and Daniel Mead Johnson.

Dr. Rice reported that the University recently received information from the University of Osnabruck (Evansville's twin city in Germany) concerning an exchange program for faculty and students. He added that he was pleased for this opportunity to maintain a beneficial relationship between the two universities.

Dr. Rice introduced newly elected Student Government Association president Paula Byassee. Paula is a senior English major.

President Rice announced that the number of applicants for admissions is greater than last year at this same time. He added that this increase reflects a trend that is taking place across the nation.

D. REPORT OF FINANCE COMMITTEE MEETING

On a motion by Mr. Boyer, seconded by Dr. Clark, the Finance Committee recommended its approval to the Board of all items discussed in the preceding committee meeting, except the item concerning changes in the retirement program. The items discussed and approved include: student fee increases, preliminary budget figures, telecommunications system funding, request for general repair and rehabilitation funds, life insurance rate change, and long-term disability rate change.

Mr. Brooks offered an amendment to delay action also on the telecommunications system funding until a more detailed analysis could be presented to the Board at its next regular meeting. Mr. Boyer accepted the amended motion, and it was seconded by Mrs. Rust.

E. APPROVAL OF REVISED EASEMENT FOR SECONDARY ELECTRICAL SERVICE LINE

At its November 3, 1988 meeting, the Board approved an easement to Southern Indiana Gas and Electric Company for the installation of the secondary electrical service line. Since approval, it has been necessary to change the path of the line. The revised easement in Exhibit I-A reflects the correct route of the line.

On a motion by Dr. Weathersby, seconded by Mr. Brooks, the revised easement in Exhibit I-A, was approved. This revised easement replaces the easement previously approved by the Board at its November 3, 1988, meeting.

F. APPROVAL OF REQUEST TO CONVEY REAL ESTATE

The Indiana Department of Highways plans to make improvements on Indiana 62 at the campus intersection. This will necessitate the conveyance of USI property to the Department of Highways for right of way.

On a motion by Mrs. Rust, seconded by Dr. Pruis, it <u>was approved</u> to convey the real estate as described in the Warranty Deed in Exhibit I-B, and to authorize the Chairman of the Board to act as Grantor, and with the Secretary of the Board, to execute all necessary documents.

G. OTHER BUSINESS

Mr. Fair appointed a nominating committee, consisting of Dr. Weathersby, Dr. Pruis, and Dr. Clark, as chairman, to prepare a slate of officers of the Board of Trustees for 1989-90. The election of officers will take place at the annual meeting in July.

SECTION II - FINANCIAL MATTERS

A. APPROVAL OF BUDGET APPROPRIATIONS, ADJUSTMENTS, AND TRANSFERS

On a motion by Dr. Weathersby, seconded by Mr. Brooks, the following Budget Appropriations, Adjustments and Transfers <u>were approved.</u>

B. ACCEPTANCE OF BIDS FOR TELECOMMUNICATIONS SYSTEM

Bids were received on April 28, 1989, for a new telecommunications system. A recommendation for acceptance of the best bid will be included in the July 1 agenda.

C. APPROVAL OF REQUEST FOR TELECOMMUNICATIONS SYSTEM FUNDING

Funding for the telecommunications system was discussed at the preceding Finance Committee meeting. A motion was made to defer action on the funding until a more detailed analysis could be presented to the Board.

A resolution requesting approval from the Indiana Commission for Higher Education and State Budget Committee for funding of the telecommunications system will be included in the July 1 agenda.

D. APPROVAL OF REQUEST FOR GENERAL REPAIR AND REHABILITATION FUNDS

At the July 7, 1988, meeting of the Board of Trustees, approval was given for a new campus-wide, fire-alarm system. The exact cost of this system now has been determined.

This request asks authorization for President Rice to seek approval from the Indiana Commission for Higher Education, the State Budget Agency, the State Budget Committee, and the Governor of the State of Indiana for the fire-alarm system at a total cost of \$76,738.

On a motion by Dr. Pruis, seconded by Dr. Weathersby, this request for general repair and rehabilitation funds was approved.

E. APPROVAL OF REVISION OF RETIREMENT PLANS

Revision of the retirement plans was discussed at the preceding Finance Committee meeting. A motion was made to defer action until more detailed information could be presented to the Board. A request for the revision of the retirement plans will be included in the July 1 agenda.

F. APPROVAL OF LIFE INSURANCE RATES FOR 1989-90

The University adopted a revised group life insurance program effective February 1, 1988. There are 140 employees currently enrolled in the revised program and 233 employees and retirees remain in the original plan. Employees hired since February 1, 1988, are required to enroll in the revised program.

The following premium rates from Manufacturers Life Insurance Company have been quoted for a twenty-four month guarantee period effective July 1, 1989.

On a motion by Mr. Boyer, seconded by Dr. Weathersby, the renewal of the master policy with Manufacturers Life Insurance Company with the above proposed rates and division of premiums effective July 1, 1989, was approved.

G. APPROVAL OF DISABILITY INSURANCE RATES FOR 1989-90

The contract for the University's Long-Term Disability Insurance program with Teachers Insurance and Annuity Association of America (TIAA) is to be renewed as of July 1, 1989. The TIAA disability coverage provides income benefits and retirement contributions in the event of a long-term disability. The University pays the total premium cost for eligible employees.

The following TIAA Long-Term Disability monthly premium rates have been quoted for a twelve-month period beginning July 1, 1989. The new rates reflect the combined effect of a change in TIAA's 1989 rate structure and the distribution of benefits for the University group since the plan was last reviewed.

A. APPROVAL OF PERSONNEL ACTIONS

On a motion by Dr. Pruis, seconded by Dr. Weathersby, the following personnel actions were approved.

1. Recommendation for Tenure

The following faculty member is recommended for continuous appointment, effective August 21, 1989.

Crayton C. Walker, Professor of Business, School of Business; formerly Professor of Information Management at the University of Connecticut. His professional career includes 24 years of prior full-time experience in higher education.

2. Approval of Promotions

The following faculty members are recommended for promotion, effective August 21, 1989.

Associate Professor to Professor

Leonard E. Dowhie, Art Department, School of Liberal Arts; M.F.A., Indiana State University; B.A.E., Arizona State University; 10 years at USI; 5 years at present rank.

Sandra M. Singer, Psychology Department, School of Liberal Arts; Ph.D., M.A., B.A., University of Colorado; 9 years at USI; 5 years at present rank.

Thomas A. Wilhelmus, English Department, School of Liberal Arts; Ph.D., University of Notre Dame, B.A., Wabash College; 18 years at USI; 11 years at present rank.

THIS INDENTURE WITNESSETH, That University of Southern Indiana by its Board of Trustees hereinafter called "Grantor", whether one or more, for and in consideration of the sum of One Dollar (\$1.00), and other valuable consideration, the receipt of which is hereby acknowledged, does hereby GRANT and CONVEY unto SOUTHERN INDIANA GAS AND ELECTRIC COMPANY, an Indiana corporation whose mailing address is 20 NW Fourth Street, Evansville, Indiana 47741-0001, its successors, assigns, and lessees (hereinafter collectively referred to as the "Company"), an easement with the right to construct, inspect, maintain, operate, repair, alter, relocate, enlarge, rebuild and remove one or more electric lines underground and one or more electric lines above ground upon one (1) line of supporting structures, together with guy wires, anchors, cables and such other appliances, fixtures, equipment and appurtenances as may be convenient or necessary for the transmission of electric energy, upon, over, under and across a strip of land FIFTEEN (15) feet in width, the approximate center line of which is shown upon the plat which is attached hereto, made a part hereof, and marked "Exhibit A", together with the right of ingress and egress over the lands of Grantor to and from said lines in the exercise of the rights herein granted, provided, that in the exercise of such rights the Company will, whenever practicable to do so, use regularly established highways or roadways.

The real estate of Grantor upon, over and across which said easement and right-of-way shall be laid out and located is situated in Perry Township, Varderburgh County, State of Indiana, and is more particularly described as follows:

Reiny a part of the Northeast Quarter of Section 31, Township 6 South, Range 11 West

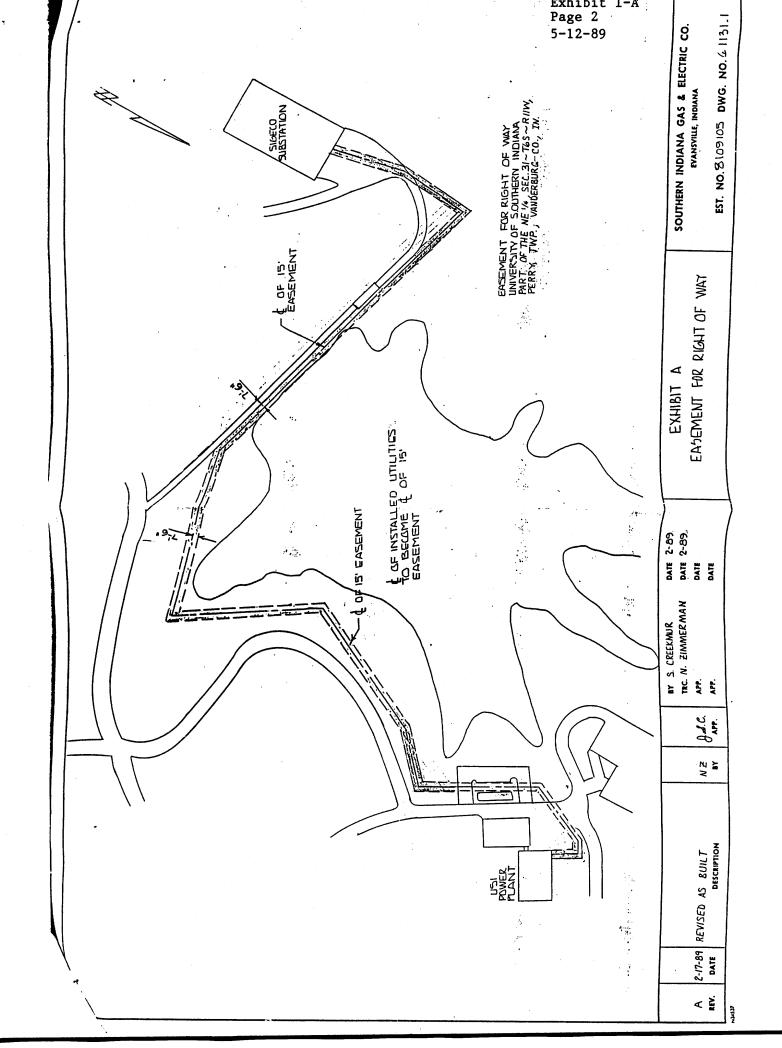
Grantor for the same consideration further grants to the Company the right to trim or remove, at Company's sole discretion, any and all trees located within said strip of land, and the right to trim or remove, at Company's sole discretion, any and all trees located outside said strip of land that are of such height that in falling directly to the ground they could come in contact with said electric lines, and the right to remove brush or other obstructions from said strip of land.

Subject to the right herein granted to the Company, the Grantor reserves the right to use and enjoy the land included within said easement and right-of-way, but no buildings, Structures, equipment, machinery, or any other type of improvement or property, either of a permanent or temporary nature, shall be located or maintained within said strip of land.
