

New Freshmen - The Admission Funnel

New freshmen are the primary source of new students at USI. Since 2010, there has been a decline in the number of applicants. In addition, with the changed admission standards to minimize the number of conditionally admitted students, USI's acceptance rate in fall 2013 of new freshmen was 69% compared to 88% in fall 2009.

New Freshmen - Demographics

USI continues to have a relatively high percentage of new freshmen who are first generation college students.

In addition, the percentage of new freshmen with at least one relative who has attended USI is growing fast with 31% of all new freshmen reporting legacy status in 2013.
