# E. REVIEW AND ACCEPTANCE OF 2009 CONFLICT OF INTEREST DISCLOSURE STATEMENT

IC 35-41-1-24 defines "public servant" as a person who (1) is authorized to perform an official function on behalf of, and is paid by, a governmental entity; or (2) is elected or appointed to office to discharge a public duty for a governmental entity.

Indiana Code (IC) 35-44-1-3 provides that "A public servant who knowingly or intentionally: (1) has a pecuniary interest in; or (2) derives a profit from a contract or purchase connected with an action by the governmental entity served by the public servant commits a conflict of interest, a Class D felony".

The law provides a method by which public servants can avoid the criminal aspect of the conflicts of interest law by filing a disclosure statement with the Board of Trustees. The Board of Trustees must then review and accept such disclosures, and must forward all disclosure statements to the State Board of Accounts. Following her board orientation session in August, Trustee Lauren K. Raikes completed a disclosure statement for 2009. She disclosed no conflicts of interest.

Approval to certify that the Board of Trustees has reviewed and accepted the disclosure is recommended.

#### SUMMER SESSIONS
