


Initial Insights from Test Optional Implementation

- More that 50% of applicants preferred not to have tests considered
- Students with higher GPAs wanted to have their test scores to be considered for admission
- 34% of enrolled students did not submit a test score (n = 451)
- Preferences varied amongst majors



More than half of applicants opted out of tests being considered for admission


Admitted Students
