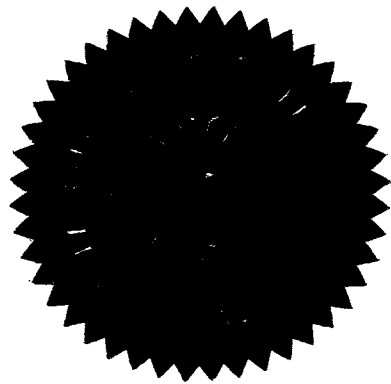

UNIVERSITY OF SOUTHERN INDIANA BOARD OF TRUSTEES

September 3, 1998

The University of Southern Indiana Board of Trustees met in annual and regular sessions on Thursday, September 3, 1998, in Carter Hall of the University Center. Present were Trustees Bruce Baker, Louise Bruce, Charles Combs, Tina Kern, Brian Pauley, Harolyn Torain, and James Will Sr. Also attending were President H. Ray Hoops; Vice Presidents John Byrd, Robert Reid, Richard Schmidt, and Sherrienne Standley; Faculty Senate Chair Connie Cooper; and Student Government Association President Patrick West.

There being a quorum present, the meeting was called to order at 2:05 p.m.

SECTION I - GENERAL AND ACADEMIC MATTERS

A. ANNUAL MEETING OF THE BOARD

The annual meeting of the University of Southern Indiana Board of Trustees was held preceding the regular session. The minutes of the annual meeting are appended.

B. APPROVAL OF MINUTES OF JUNE 19, 1998, MEETING

On a motion by Mr. Will, seconded by Mr. Baker, the minutes of the June 19, 1998 meeting were approved.

C. ESTABLISHMENT OF NEXT MEETING DATE, TIME, LOCATION

The next regular meeting of the Board of Trustees was set for Thursday, November 5, 1998, at the University of Southern Indiana.

D. PRESIDENT'S REPORT

Dr. Hoops remarked that the first week of classes is always a wonderful time to welcome trustees to campus, giving them a glimpse of the heightened activity that comes with the start of a new year. Dr. Hoops called on Faculty Senate Chair Connie Cooper for an update from the faculty perspective.

Mrs. Cooper reported on the Faculty Senate retreat held last week in New Harmony, as well as the various committees and their goals for the coming year.

Dr. Hoops then called on Student Government Association president Patrick West for a look ahead to the coming year.

Mr. West reviewed many of the activities planned for the new school year to get more students involved, as well as to serve the students and the University community. He also thanked Mrs. Kern for attending the student welcome dinner.

Dr. Hoops next called on Vice President John Byrd who reported that although students continued to enroll, enrollment had reached a new record, 8400, an increase of about one percent. He noted that on-campus apartments were filled, including the three new buildings, and that approximately 100 students are housed in apartments on the East side.

Dr. Hoops expressed pleasure in welcoming more than 400 in attendance at the largest-ever President's Associates dinner the preceding night, recognizing the University's major donors. He noted that much of the increase is the result of Campaign USI, but expectations are that this level of involvement in the University and its private giving program will continue after the close of the campaign. The President's Associates are USI's pacesetters in charitable giving, contributing over \$6.9 million in 1997/98. This amounts to 93 percent of the USI Foundation's nearly \$7.4 million in gifts. In one year's time, there are 165 new members of the President's

Associates, who qualify by making gifts of \$1,000 or more annually. Even more impressive is the jump in Perpetual Members, which requires a one-time gift of \$25,000 or more. Last night, the University recognized 26 new Perpetual Members.

Dr. Hoops noted that a request for approval of the honorary doctorate for USI Foundation chair Ted Ziemer, who is honored for his leadership during the Foundation's greatest period of growth as well as during the first capital campaign, is in the agenda today. He noted that Mr. Ziemer is highly worthy of the University's recognition.

Another honor Dr. Hoops called attention to is the most recent recognition of Human Resources Director Nancy Byrd. In August, she was singled out as Outstanding Chapter Leader by the Indiana State Conference of the Society for Human Resource Management. The conference was attended by over 500 human resource professionals. Mrs. Byrd was cited for her service in several board positions, including president, for the Evansville Personnel Association, and for her community involvement.

A continuing concern of the University is the placement of graduates in the area of their major, and one field which has posed some challenges has been the field of teaching. Many education graduates wish to stay in the Evansville region after graduation, but the open positions have not been plentiful enough to accommodate the number of graduates. Dr. Hoops noted that this year, USI is experiencing more than a doubling of the normal number of placements with about one third of the graduates now in their classrooms. This improvement is related to several factors. First, that the preparation of the education graduates is excellent and thus they are in demand. Second, there appears to be some movement in the senior teaching ranks, with retirements creating more open positions. And third, more of the graduates are willing to accept assignments away from the tri-state. This is to be expected as students come from more distant Indiana counties. Indeed, those placements will be desirable as the University extends its reach statewide.

Dr. Hoops recalled several activities that have taken place since the board last met, including:

Volunteer USI held its second annual recognition program, awarding Joanne Wright its Founder's Award for her role in organizing the volunteer services program, and selecting Joe Cannon, one of USI's top athletics volunteers, as the Volunteer of the Year. This year's program noted the contributions of more than 1,700 volunteers who have given 131,349 hours since July of 1996. In calculating those hours at the minimum wage, they will amount to more than \$675,000 in one year's time. The University is clearly in the debt of these faithful volunteers who make it possible for us to provide services we might not provide otherwise. Dr. Hoops also stressed that these volunteer hours worked are in addition to, and did not replace, any University employee.

The annual employee recognition banquet for clerical support staff honored 15 five-year employees, 9 ten-year employees, 4 twenty-year employees and two retirees.

Opening meetings were held for clerical support staff and for faculty and administrators. At the clerical support meeting, 32 new staff members since January were welcomed and those in attendance learned more about how to use technology in their jobs.

At the faculty and administrative staff meeting, 38 new faculty and administrators were introduced, and nationally-known futurist and technology guru Michael Dolence spoke on the Age of Learning.

Both New Harmony Theatre and the dramas at Lincoln Amphitheatre have completed seasons with rave reviews from audiences and critics alike. Although the financial reports are not quite completed, it appears that the fiscal picture will also be good again this year.

Completing the University's biennial Operating Budget Request for 1999-2001 also was a focus of summer activity, which request for the Board's approval is in the agenda today.

Campaign USI received a boost from the estate of Louis and Anne Harpole, Evansville residents who were involved in the early fund drives to support the establishment of public higher education here. They bequeathed over \$900,000 to establish student scholarships, and in so doing, made the largest bequest to date to USI. Dr. Hoops noted the initial use of the Harpole Scholarship Endowment will be used to underwrite six Presidential Scholarships.

One of the most important programs which has resulted from Campaign USI is the O'Daniel Student Leadership Academy, created with a \$100,000 endowment gift from Joe and Marie O'Daniel. The results of the leadership training provided by this program are beginning to be seen. Dr. Hoops called on Dr. Byrd and Lisa McGuire, Program Advisor in the Office of Student Development, for a report. Dr. Byrd noted that student participation in this Academy is voluntary. Ms. McGuire summarized the goals of the Academy and then called on students Troy Rhinefort and Kelly Litteken who related their own positive experiences and how they have benefited from their involvement with the O'Daniel Leadership Academy.

E. REPORT OF THE LONG-RANGE PLANNING COMMITTEE

Mr. Baker reported that Dr. Reid presented a summary of the responsibilities of the Long-Range Planning Committee along with a proposed schedule of meetings for the next two years.

F. APPROVAL OF CANDIDATE FOR HONORARY DEGREE

On a motion by Mr. Baker, seconded by Mrs. Bruce, the conferral of the following honorary degree at the September 2, 1998, President's Associates dinner was approved.

DOCTOR OF LAWS to Theodore Charles Ziemer III, Chair of the USI Foundation (1992-1998), attorney-at-law, and civic leader

G. APPROVAL OF AMENDMENT TO THE BYLAWS

The following amendment to the Bylaws of the University of Southern Indiana Board of Trustees was presented in writing at the June 19, 1998, Board meeting.

On a motion by Mr. Will, seconded by Mr. Combs, the following amendment to the Bylaws was approved. The amended Bylaws are appended.

Article III should be amended to read:

Section 1. Annual Meeting. The annual meeting of the Board of Trustees shall be held after July 1 at a time and place as shall be fixed in the notice of such meeting, for the purpose of electing officers and transacting such other business as may be brought before the meeting. Notice of such annual meeting shall be mailed by the secretary to each member not less than five (5) days in advance of such meeting.

H. OTHER BUSINESS

Chair Harolyn Torain reported that in compliance with the Presidential Assessment Plan filed and approved by the Board of Trustees in January 1995, the formal presidential assessment has been completed. Interviews were conducted by the trustees with President Hoops' direct reports and with representatives of the Alumni Association, Faculty Senate, Staff Council, Student Government Association, USI Foundation Board of Directors, and five community leaders. Input was also sought from the academic deans. This morning President Hoops received a very positive report from the Trustees, resulting in an extension of his contract to August 31, 2004. Mrs. Torain thanked trustees Bruce Baker, Tina Kern, and Jim Will for serving with her on the assessment team which produced the final report, and offered to President Hoops the Board's appreciation for his efforts on behalf of this University.

SECTION II - FINANCIAL MATTERS

A. REPORT OF THE FINANCE COMMITTEE

Richard Schmidt reported that the Finance Committee approved a resolution approving and authorizing the sale of student housing bonds.

B. REPORT OF THE CONSTRUCTION COMMITTEE

Mr. Combs reported that after review of the Responses to the Request for Proposal for the Wellness, Fitness, Recreational Center, the Construction Committee selected the proposal of the Merci-Kinkel Collaborative. (Note: Action on the site development bids for the Student Residential Complex Project is contained in the minutes of the Joint Meeting of the Finance and Construction Committees of September 3, 1998.)

C. REPORT ON CURRENT CONSTRUCTION PROJECTS

Physical Plant Director Steve Helfrich reported construction of the Liberal Arts Center and the athletic fields on Broadway are on schedule. He also reported on the progress of the locker room renovation in the Physical Activities Center, new student housing, Science Center labs, University Center Conference Center, and University Center parking lot, and noted that work will begin soon on the Art Studio and the lower level of the Health Professions Center.

D. APPROVAL OF CHANGE ORDER FOR THE LIBERAL ARTS CENTER PROJECT

On a motion by Mrs. Kern, seconded by Mr. Will, the proposed change order for the Liberal Arts Center Project in Exhibit II-A was approved.

E. APPROVAL OF LEGISLATIVE OPERATING AND LINE ITEM BUDGET REQUESTS FOR 1999-2001

The request for operating and line item appropriations for the 1999-2001 biennium submitted to the Indiana Commission for Higher Education, the State Budget Agency, and the Indiana General Assembly has been prepared under the instructions of the State Budget Agency and the Commission for Higher Education. A summary of the budget request is presented in Exhibit II-B.

On a motion by Mr. Baker, seconded by Mrs. Kern, the Operating and Line Item Budget Requests for 1999-2001 were approved.

SUMMARY OF THE UNIVERSITY OF SOUTHERN INDIANA'S 1999-2001 OPERATING BUDGET REQUEST

The key elements of the University of Southern Indiana's 1999-2001 Operating Budget Request are outlined below.

- *Funding for Maintenance for Current Programs for both years of the 1999-2001 biennium.*
- *Base adjustments for Prior Increases in Enrollment, Degree Completion, and Plant Expansion.*
- *Funding for Quality Improvement Initiatives to address needs in technology to improve recruitment, retention, and training of information technology professionals; replace the library's operating system; expand workforce programming; improve student retention; and, develop partnerships with K-12 schools in rural communities.*
- *Bonding authority and fee replacement funding for a new Science/Education Classroom Building.*
- *Funding of the Repair and Rehabilitation and Infrastructure formulas in both years of the 1999-2001 biennium.*

The University of Southern Indiana requests support from the State of Indiana for its 1999-2001 Operating Budget Request. The funding requested for growth in enrollment, maintenance of current programs, support for quality improvement initiatives, capital projects, and repair and rehabilitation projects is needed for the University to be able to serve the southern Indiana region and to help achieve the goals of the state.

The committee has been guided by the statement pertaining to leadership of the Board and continuity and change, first adopted by the Trustees in 1986, and requests that the statement be entered into minutes of this annual meeting.

It is the sense of the nominating committee that the leadership of the officers of the Board of Trustees should be balanced between the elements of continuity and change -- **continuity** to provide a kind of stability in the officership of the Board; **change** to take advantage of the talents of the several members of the Board.

To that end, without establishing maximum terms of office for any officer position of the Board, it is recommended that, at each annual election of officers, the Board consciously consider the values both of continuity and change for each officer position and of the development of new leadership among the Board and the University officers.
