#### D. AUTHORIZATION FOR RENOVATION OF THE PHYSICAL ACTIVITIES CENTER (PAC)

The 2013 Indiana General Assembly appropriated \$18 million in cash to the University of Southern Indiana to undertake three projects: renovation of the Biology Department in the Science Center; renovation of selected areas of the Art Department in the Technology Center; and renovation of selected areas and possible expansion of the Physical Activities Center.

The Science Center and Technology Center Renovations were approved by the Trustees in November 2013. These two projects combined were budgeted at \$2 million. The Science Center is complete and the Technology Center Phase I of III is nearing completion.

The University would like to advance the Physical Activities Center project for authorization in order for architect selection to be completed in 2014 and construction to begin in late 2015.

Approval of the following resolution is recommended:

- WHEREAS, the 2013 Indiana General Assembly appropriated \$18 million in cash to the University of Southern Indiana to undertake three projects: renovation of the Biology Department in the lower level of the Science Center; renovation of selected areas for the Art Department in the Technology Center; and renovation of selected areas and possible expansion of the Physical Activities Center; and
- WHEREAS, the University of Southern Indiana Board of Trustees previously approved the renovation of the Biology Department in the lower level of the Science Center and the renovation of selected areas for the Art Department in the Technology Center; and
- WHEREAS, the University wishes to proceed with renovation and possible expansion of the Physical Activities Center; and
- WHEREAS, the University proposes a project budget of \$16 million for the Physical Activities Center renovation and possible expansion; and
- WHEREAS, approvals may be required between the regular meetings of the Board of Trustees;
- NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Board of Trustees authorizes the Finance/Audit Committee to approve selection of the architect and engineering firms, and review design plans, cost estimates, and construction schedules for the project; to review construction bids; to award contracts or reject any or all construction bids for the project; and to report the progress of the project to the Board of Trustees;
- FURTHER RESOLVED, that the president of the University is authorized to request the Indiana Commission for Higher Education, the Indiana State Budget Committee, and the governor of the State of Indiana to approve the Physical Activities Center project.

# 2013-2014 Student Financial Aid Programs Final Report University of Southern Indiana November 6, 2014

### **Executive Summary**

The final report of student financial aid activity in 2013-2014 contains summary and programspecific data of all student aid programs administered by the offices of Student Financial Assistance, Veterans' Support Services, and Career Services and Internships. Key indicators contained in the 2013-2014 report are:

#### **Service Profiles**

Student Financial Assistance served 12,929 new and prospective students, of which 12,861 filed a Free Applications for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) for need-based assistance. Each student received an award letter detailing all federal, state, USI Foundation, USI institutional and private/outside awards. Student Financial Assistance provided aid to 8,008 enrolled students resulting in 19,151 awards totaling \$73.4 million, which is a slight decrease from the prior year in part due to enrollment.

# **Final Report**

#### Introduction

This report contains both summary and program-specific information for all student financial assistance programs administered by the University. Data used in compiling the report was obtained from the University's administrative system on October 13, 2014. Data was provided by Human Resources, the Business Office, and Veteran Support Services. The Student Financial Assistance Office, Veteran Support Services, the Business Office and the Career Services and Placement Office provide assistance to students in obtaining the types of financial aid included in this report.

#### **Narrative**

Students and prospective students submitted 12,861 Free Applications for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) for need-based assistance. Of this number, 7,734 enrolled in 2013-2014 and 7,495 students received Title IV aid. Total FAFSA applications decreased 5.6 percent over 2012-2013.

The University administered 19,151 awards for a total of \$73.4 million in student financial assistance. The distribution of awards by funding source is given below.

# **Federal Pell Grant Program**

The Federal Pell Grant Program is the cornerstone of aid packages for exceptionally needy students. The number of Pell Grant recipients decreased 7.1 percent following a 7.7 percent decrease in 2012-2013. Total Pell dollars decreased 5.5 percent following a 6.8 percent decrease in the prior year.

#### State Funds

Total Indiana funding was down 2.3 percent in 2013-2014 following a 2.7 percent increase in 2012-2013. There are several key factors that have influenced the decrease in state aid. The first key factor was the introduction of new Indiana State legislation that was effective with the 2013-2014 award year. This new legislation imposed stricter requirements for new state aid recipients to receive and retain aid eligibility. The new law requires students first entering college in fall 2013 and receiving the Frank O'Bannon Award to complete 30 credit hours their first year, 60 credit hours by the end of their second year, and 90 credit hours by the end of their third year for an "on-time" award. Students who do not reach those milestones may still receive an award, which will be a slightly smaller dollar amount, but must still complete 24 credits by the end of their first year, 48 credit hours by the end of their second year, and 72 credit hours by the end of their third year.

Students who received their first state financial aid award prior to the 2013-2014 academic year are not affected by the new legislation. The students still must adhere to the requirements that were in effect before the new legislation.

#### Federal Direct Loan Program

Aggregate borrowing for Direct Stafford Student Loan recipients among the Class of 2014 baccalaureate graduates averaged \$23,646. Among 2014 masters' and doctoral degree recipients, aggregate borrowing averaged \$33,356, including both graduate and undergraduate borrowing. These figures are based on borrowing while enrolled at USI.

Fiscal year 2011 was the last year the federal government calculated a 2-year cohort default rate (CDR). The transition was made to calculate the CDR based on three years of data instead of two years because of growing speculation that student deferment and forbearances were causing the rates to be inaccurate because the two-year time period. The Department of

Education has calculated both two and three-year rates for the past three years in preparation for the transition. Beginning in 2014 institutions will only receive a fiscal 3-year CDR.

The fiscal year 2011 3-year national student loan CDR is 13.7 percent, down from fiscal year 2010 3-year rate of 14.7 percent. The State of Indiana 3-year rate is 15.5 percent, up 0.6 percent over the prior year. USI's fiscal year 2011 3-year CDR is 9.4 percent, down 1.0 percent over the prior 3-year rate. Public institutions 3-year CDR rates are 12.9 percent, less than 1.0 percent over prior year. USI's 3-year CDR is significantly less than public institutions, national and state rates.
