INDEPENDENCE DAY CELEBRATION 10 A.M. JULY 4





DRIFTWOOD: THE LIFE OF HARLAN HUBBARD ON EXHIBIT THROUGH JULY 12

Driftwood: The Life of Harlan Hubbard is a traveling panel exhibit based on Jessica K. Whitehead's new biography of visionary northern Kentucky artist, writer and sustainability pioneer Harlan Hubbard (1900–88). Often compared to Henry David Thoreau for his simple, self-sufficient lifestyle, Hubbard and his wife, Anna, spent eight years journeying down the Ohio and Mississippi Rivers on a shantyboat and then built a home at Payne Hollow, Kentucky. Hubbard's books about their river journey and lifestyle that rejected consumer culture inspired back-to-nature movements in the 1960s and 1970s.

Driftwood will be on display at the Athenum Visitors Center through Saturday, July 12.

SIGNALS AND SATELLITES TO THE ANCESSTARS BY CHRISTOPHER BLAY ON EXHIBIT THROUGH LATE AUGUST

Christopher Blay's temporary public art project located at Maclure Square, *Signals and Satellites to the AncesStars*, forms a dialogue with the layered histories present along the shores of the Wabash River and in New Harmony. The installation evokes the origin myths of the Osage and Myaamia nations who originally inhabited land in present-day Indiana and believed their ancestors emerged from the celestial sky and from bodies of water. The sculpture also plays homage to the early Black pioneers arriving in this area in the early 19th century in what was then the Northwest Territory, as these early homesteaders often navigated trails by starlight. This sculptural installation forms a satellite array made from steel and natural materials that "beams" out layered narratives invoking regional history.
