The Honorable John Massie Mutz Will Deliver Commencement Address



The Commencement address today will be delivered by the Honorable John Massie Mutz, Lieutenant Governor of the State of Indiana. He is a man who has achieved distinction in business as well as in public service.

Lieutenant Governor Mutz became interested in government as a high school junior in Indianapolis, when he served as president of the Broad Ripple High School student council. In 1953, he graduated third in his class and was named the most outstanding high school senior in the city.

While attending Northwestern University, he won the National Conference of Christians and Jews Award for the betterment of relations between the various races and religions on campus. A business and advertising major, Mr. Mutz earned the bachelor's degree in 1957 and the master's degree in 1958. When he graduated, he accepted a position with ALCOA to direct its public relations program for residential building products. In 1960, he returned to Indianapolis and spent the next two years sharpening his business skills as an officer of the Perine Development Corporation. Then, in 1962, Mr.Mutz joined Circle Leasing Corporation and served as its vice president until January 1981. He also served until 1981 as vice president and part owner of Circle Financial Corporation, a real estate investment firm, and the Fast Food Management Corporation, which operates 70 Burger Chef restaurants in Indiana and Kentucky.

The successful businessman applied

his business and financial acumen in the Indiana General Assembly where he established an impressive record for fiscal accountability in government. Elected to the House of Representatives in 1967, he was re-elected in 1969 and in 1970 was the Republican Party's nominee for State Treasurer. In 1972, he was elected to fill a vacancy in the Indiana Senate, then was re-elected in 1974 and 1978. His work on the important Senate Budget Committee moved the Indianapolis Star to label him "the taxpayer's friend" for his leadership in taxation and government efficiency. chairman of the State Budget Committee, he participated in the drafting of virtually every piece of tax legislation enacted during the past decade.

Mr. Mutz taught budgeting and taxation for four years in the School of Public and Environmental Affairs at Indiana University-Purdue University-Indianapolis. He was one of two outstanding legislators from Indiana to attend the prestigious Eagleton Institute of Politics. He was sworn in as Lieutenant Governor of Indiana in January 1981.

The Lieutenant Governor is a trustee of the Christian Theological Seminary in Indianapolis and has lent his energies to several organizations including the Greater Indianapolis Progress Committee, the United Way Board of Governors, and the Suemma Coleman Agency. He and his wife Carolyn have two children who both attend Northwestern University.

He will receive the honorary Doctor of Civil Law degree in today's ceremony.

Rossanna McGinnis Enlow



Rossanna McGinnis Enlow, president and chairman of the board of *The Evansville Courier*, has been active in advancing the arts, particularly for young people, in Evansville.

A leader in Evansville's music community, she became an accomplished pianist at an early age, studying under world-renowned teachers and achieving concert status as a young woman. Mrs. Enlow, a lifelong resident of Evansville, graduated from Central High School and entered DePauw University at age 15. She received the Bachelor of Music degree with highest honors from the New England Conservatory of Music in Boston, where she achieved the highest record ever attained at the school. She also studied piano at the Juilliard School of Music and was a soloist with the Boston Symphony Orchestra while a Juilliard student.

In 1931, she married Robert Enlow, a young lawyer and banker who was to acquire controlling interest in The Evansville Courier in 1952. For many years, she and her husband sponsored the Rossanna Enlow Young Artists Awards competition, with the purpose of discovering and encouraging young people with musical promise. Additionally, The Courier, with the leadership from the Enlow family, sponosored the Tri-State Youth Concert for a number of vears. Mrs. Enlow's interests have encompassed a wide range of community activities. She has been president of the local Girl Scout Council, of the Rathbone Home, and of the Evansville Philharmonic Board. She also is a past member of the Public Health Nursing Association board and has been an elder, trustee, and Women's Association president of First Presbyterian Church.

Mrs. Enlow and her late husband shared a keen interest in the *Courier*. She followed him as chairman of the board after his death fourteen years ago and has been president as well since 1980. Mrs. Enlow is the mother of two daughters. She will receive the honorary Doctor of Laws degree.

Bernard Edward Schnacke



Bernard Edward Schnacke is a successful businessman and civic leader who, for more than two decades, has dedicated his energies to health care planning. He first joined the Deaconess Hospital board of directors in 1961. In the 21 years since, he has been assistant secretary, treasurer, vice president, and president. He held the presidency for six years and currently is chairman of the executive committee and vice president of the Deaconess Service Corporation. Mr. Schnacke is the first hospital trustee ever to serve on the Indiana Hospital Association's board of directors. helped to found the National Association of Voluntary Trustees of Not-for-Profit Hospitals and serves on that group's board of directors. He has been president of the Tri-State Health Planning Council and chairman of the Regional Health and Retardation Planning Committee. For

his many contributions to health care, Mr. Schnacke received the Governor's Citation for Health Care Planning.

A graduate of Central High School, Mr. Schnacke holds the Bachelor of Arts degree and the Master of Business Administration degree from the University of Michigan. After graduation, he returned to Evansville and worked for two vears with Servel Corporation before becoming president of North Star Furniture Corporation in 1937, a position he held until 1966 when the company was sold. He now is president of North Star Corporation, an investment company. Mr. Schnacke also has been president of the Schutz-Hermann Tobacco Company and for 20 years was a member of the board of directors of the Lamasco Bank.

His other civic interests include the United Way, the Evansville Philharmonic Orchestra and the Lutheran Child Welfare Association. He has been president and treasurer of Trinity Lutheran Church and now is chairman of the Trinity Memorial Trust Fund. In 1971, he was named Lutheran of the Year by the Evansville Lutheran Club. He and his wife Ruth have three children. Mr. Schnacke will receve the Doctor of Laws degree today.

William Edward Wilson



William Edward Wilson, professor emeritus of English at Indiana University, has distinguished himself as a writer and scholar. The son of an Evansville congressman, he attended public schools and graduated from Central High School. While at Harvard University, where he received the Bachelor of Arts degree cum laude in 1927 and the Master of Arts degree in 1930, he won the Helen Choate Bell prize for excellence in writing.

He began his writing career as a reporter for *The Evansville Press* in 1927. Since then, his life has been devoted to writing, newspaperwork, and teaching. He is the author of thirteen books and numerous short stories and articles. Many of his books are set in Indiana and reflect his study of the history of the state, especially of the southwestern Indiana region.

Professor Wilson has been on the faculty of Indiana University since 1950 as professor of English and later as James A. Work professor of English. At IU, he has taught graduate and undergraduate courses in fiction writing and American literature. Prior to 1950, he was a member of the faculty of Brown University and chairman of the English department of the Rhode Island School of Design. He also taught at the University of Colorado and directed the Writer's Conference in the Rocky Mountains.

Many honors have been bestowed on Professor Wilson. He has held a Guggenheim Fellowship and two Fulbright Fellowships. In 1962, he won the Southeastern Theatre Association Award for his play, Abe Lincoln of Pigeon Creek. In 1967, he received an award of merit from the American Association for State and Local History for Indiana: A History. Three Author's Day awards came to him in 1959, 1965, and 1966.

Professor Wilson and his late wife Ellen had three sons. He later married Hana Benes, a faculty member at Indiana University in Czech language and literature.

Professor Wilson will receive the Doctor of Humane Letters degree.

Scholarship Honors

The student graduating with the highest scholarship index will be graduated summa cum laude. Students graduating with a scholarship index of 3.80 or higher will be graduated magna cum laude. Those with a scholarship index between 3.60 and 3.80 will be graduated cum laude. These achievements are set forth on the individual diplomas. Honor students can be recognized in the commencement exercises by the colored stoles and tassels. Gold indicates summa cum laude; red, magna cum laude; and blue, cum laude.

Academic Dress

The academic costume dates from medieval days when university students wore woolen and fur garments for warmth in damp and drafty buildings. Most of those studying were clerics in the holy orders; they wore a cloak to which was attached a hood that could be pulled up to cover their tonsured heads. Simplified to-day, the costume serves to remind us that its wearer is a member of an ancient and venerable profession; it also indicates by its color and design its wearer's degree and the institution by which the degree was conferred.

In the United States, black has been the traditional color for academic gowns, but some institutions authorize holders of their doctorates to wear colors of the institution. The bachelor's gown is distinguished by its

long, open sleeves; the master's by its closed, slitted sleeves; the doctor's by its full sleeves trimmed with bands of velvet, which may be black or a color denoting the field in which the degree was taken.

The mortarboard cap, proper for all degrees, is black. Tassels, usually black, are worn over the left front quarter of the cap. Holders of the doctorate may wear tassels of gold thread.

Academic hoods vary in length according to the degree and are lined with the colors of the institution by which the degree was granted. The honorary doctoral hoods of Indiana State University are black, lined with blue satin with white satin chevrons. They are edged with velvet trimming of black to match the gown.
