




George Rogers Clark National Historical Park

Cannelton Cotton Mill

Built in 1849, Cannelton Cotton Mill is one of the most impressive pre-Civil War mills in the Midwest. The mill operated for over 100 years and produced military uniforms during the Civil War and both World

Wars. The building was named a National Historic Landmark in 1991 and was rehabilitated into apartments in 2003.

interactive exhibits on geology, archaeology, the Lewis and Clark expedition and ecology. You also can see a full-size mammoth skeleton.

Howard Steamboat Museum

Housed in a stately 22-room late Victorian mansion, the Howard Steamboat Museum features stained glass windows and intricate hand-carved furnishings. See artifacts and models of famous boats built in the Howard Shipyard.

With its hand-painted ceilings, carved rosewood staircase, marble fireplaces and crystal chandeliers, the Culbertson Mansion reflects the affluence of William S. Culbertson. Once the wealthiest man in Indiana, Culbertson built this New Albany three-story mansion in 1867. It encompasses more than 20,000 square feet and has 25 rooms.

Carnegie Center for Art and History

The Carnegie Center for Art and History is a contemporary art gallery and history museum featuring New Albany's part in the Underground Railroad. The Center's exhibitions and programs help you enjoy works of art and learn about the process of creative expression.

Located at Falls of the Ohio State Park, George Rogers Clark Homesite is a historical representation of the cabin

George Rogers Clark built in 1803. The site also is where Meriweather Lewis and William Clark departed to explore the Louisiana Purchase territory.

Rose Island Amusement Park at Charlestown State Park

In the Roaring '20s, ferries brought Louisville residents to the Rose Island Amusement Park. It featured a dance hall, wooden roller coaster, zoo, dining hall and a swimming pool. Hike down to the exhibit and walk the original paths that Rose Island visitors traversed. Call in advance to schedule a guided hike with an interpretive naturalist.

Crawford County

Ohio River

Serving as Crawford County's southern boundary for approximately 15 miles, the Ohio River provides water enthusiasts with lots of opportunities to boat, fish and ski. Public access ramps are



located at Leavenworth and Alton.

Marengo Cave

Marengo Cave offers cave tours, gemstone mining, canoeing, campgrounds, picnic areas and walking trails. The cave has been open for tours since its discovery in 1883.

Hoosier National Forest

Washington County

Salem Courthouse Square Salem, Indiana

Located in Salem's historic downtown district, the Washington County Courthouse was built in 1888 out of locally quarried limestone.

The John Hay Center is a museum complex that includes the Stevens Museum, a pioneer village, the Depot Railroad

Museum and the birthplace of John Milton Hay, a Salem native who served as secretary to Abraham Lincoln.

Of the 65 mills that operated in Washington County, Beck's Mill is the only one still standing. The mill was built in 1808 and operated until 1914.



Scott County

Pigeon Roost Monument

Located between Scottsburg and Henryville, the Pigeon Roost Monument honors 24 settlers who were killed in an attack by Native Americans shortly after the War of 1812 began.

Scott County Museum and Heritage Center

Scott County Museum and Heritage Center is housed in a building that was formerly a working farm and home for the poor. The museum includes historical exhibits as well as ghost tours, art classes and a lunch lecture series.

Hardy Lake & the Dwight R. Chamberlain Raptor Center

This 2,178-acre recreational area features a 741-acre lake for fishing, boating, swimming and skiing. Other activities include a raptor exhibit, camping, hiking, and interpretive and recreational programs. The Chamberlain Raptor Center rehabs injured raptors and maintains permanently injured non-releasable birds for public education.

Knobstone Trail Scottsburg, Indiana

Knobstone Trail is Indiana's longest natural surface footpath. The popular backcountry trail runs along high ridges which offer great views across the wooded hills of southern Indiana.

Harrison County

Part of the Binkley Cave System, Indiana Caverns is Indiana's longest cave and includes ice age bones, a walking tour with boat ride and many other activities.

Corydon Capitol State Historic Site

As the state's first capitol building, Corydon Capitol State Historic Site is an important part of Indiana's history. After Indianapolis became the state capital in 1825, the Corydon Capitol served as the Harrison County courthouse and became a state historic site in 1930.



O'Bannon Woods State Park consists of 3,000 acres that border the Ohio River. Outdoor enthusiasts can enjoy hiking, horseback riding, fishing, boating, camping and picnicking.

Squire Boone Caverns and Village

Discovered in 1790 by Squire and Daniel Boone, the caverns are home to underground rivers and waterfalls. After exploring the caverns, visitors can mine for gems and watch demonstrations at the village and restored mill built by Squire Boone in the early 1800s.
