Title and Purpose

Best Practices in Dementia Care: Seeing It From the Other Side: The purpose of this program is to prepare direct care providers to implement effective caring strategies for persons with dementia.

Description

This session is designed to help direct care providers appreciate ground-breaking information in understanding dementia.
