

FRESHMAN AND TRANSFER STUDENTS with less than 60 credit hours

► Part A: Advising and Course Registration Appointment

All students will be advised and registered for courses prior to attending Screaming Eagles Orientation. Students will make a reservation for an advising appointment after they reserve their date for orientation. At this appointment, you will develop a schedule for your first semester of classes. This appointment will be about 30 minutes and conducted online via Zoom.

Prepare for this appointment by completing the following:

- ☐ Submit transcripts for all college credit earned.
- ☐ Have information for all college credit currently enrolled, including AP credit, available at appointment.
- ☐ Complete all required placement tests:

Part B: Screaming Eagles Orientation

- Learn information that will be important as you begin your academic career at USI.
- Meet with an advisor to register for courses (if needed) or get questions answered.

- Visit campus offices, tour housing and campus facilities, get student ID and visit the Campus Store.

TRANSFER STUDENTS with more than 59 credit hours or STUDENTS 25 YEARS OF AGE OR OLDER

Part A: Advising and Course Registration Appointment

Students will make a reservation for an advising appointment after they make a reservation for online orientation or complete online orientation. At the advising appointment, you will develop a schedule for your first semester of classes. This appointment will be about 30 minutes and conducted online via Zoom.

Prepare for this appointment by completing the following:

- ☐ Complete New Student Online Orientation.
- ☐ Submit transcripts for all college credit earned.
- ☐ Have information for all college credit currently enrolled available at appointment.
- ☐ Complete all required placement tests:

► Part B: New Student Online Orientation

Online orientation will provide you with information about advising, academic requirements, financial aid and billing, campus services and resources, and answer many other questions you have about attending USI. You will complete this orientation at your own pace. It will take you 2-3 hours to complete. You don't need to do it in one sitting, but you will need to log in with the same information for the system to remember where you left off. You can access this through your Admitted Student Task List in myUSI beginning March 1, 2025. We encourage you to complete it prior to your advising and registration appointment.

You may opt to attend an in-person Screaming Eagles Orientation (Transfer students with 12–59 credit hours) instead of the online orientation.

PARENT AND FAMILY ORIENTATION •

As a parent, family member or supporter of a USI student, you play a vital role in your student's transition to college. We encourage you to participate in Parent and Family Orientation. There is no additional fee for guests to participate in orientation. We will provide lunch for up to two guests per student. You will learn about the University and its many resources and become a partner with the University in supporting your student's success in transitioning to college.

Screaming Eagles Orientation Parent Track

At the on-campus orientation session, there will be specific sessions and workshops geared towards parents, families and supporters of our new students. You will have opportunities to learn more about specific areas of interest and visit campus offices to take care of any business. When students are completing their reservation for orientation, they will be able to sign up guests. Students are limited to 2 guests. If the student has already made a reservation for Screaming Eagles Orientation, they can go back into their reservation and make edits.






MAKING A RESERVATION FOR ORIENTATION AND ADVISING **Q**

Make a reservation as soon as possible for best selection. As part of the reservation you will select a time for your advising and registration appointment and make reservations for any guest attending with you.

Make your reservations online by following these easy steps:

(You will need to pay the enrollment deposit for this to be available.)

- Go to my.USI.edu.
- · Log in with your myUSI username and password.
- Click on the Admitted Student Task List icon under "Admitted Student."
- Select "Screaming Eagles Orientation" on the Task List.
- Fill out the form and make sure you click "Submit."





Need myUSI Username and Password?

Cost for Students

The cost for you to participate in Orientation is included on your first tuition bill as the matriculation fee. This fee covers the cost of Orientation, Welcome Week and other programs for new students at USI. This is a one-time, non-refundable fee paid by all new students to the University who register for classes.

OVERNIGHT ACCOMODATIONS

Night in the Nest

On-Campus Evening Prior to Session

Experience what living on campus has to offer by participating in the Night in the Nest. Night in the Nest will be filled with engaging activities to meet other new and returning students and experience a little of USI. You will stay overnight in the residence halls. The program portion will be from 6:30–10 p.m. Snacks will be provided as part of the event.

This overnight experience costs \$36.80 (including sales tax and innkeeper's tax) per person. This fee will be posted to your University account. No payment is due at the time of making a reservation. Indicate on your orientation reservation if you plan to participate in Night at the Nest.

Family members are welcome to stay on campus as well for \$36.80 per person. Your student can indicate that on the orientation reservation.

Check-in for Night in the Nest and overnight on-campus housing will be between 6–8 p.m. the evening prior to your confirmed session in one of the residence halls. Location will be shared in confirmation and/or reminder emails. Watch for signs on campus. Check-out is 6:30–8:30 a.m. on orientation day. You may park near the residence hall.

On-campus overnight accommodations are not available for evening prior to the August 13 orientation. However, if you plan to live on campus, you may request an early move-in date of August 12.

Hotels

If you decide not to stay on campus, but need overnight accommodations, check the orientation website for hotels in the area. Let them know you are visiting the University of Southern Indiana as some provide a discount.



ADMITTED STUDENT TASK LIST **Q**

The Admitted Student Task List provides a comprehensive list of tasks a new student needs to complete prior to beginning classes at USI. We have compiled them in one location to help you keep track. Use this task list to track your progress through the steps.

How to access the Task List:

- Go to my.USI.edu.
- · Log in with your myUSI username and password.
- Click on the Admitted Student Task List under "Admitted Student."

Tasks will become available between admission and classes starting based upon when those tasks should be completed. You will see a date next to some tasks which indicates when that task will become available to complete. Other tasks may not be able to be completed unless an earlier task is completed.



Each task list item will provide you instructions on how to complete it. If you need help, click on the question mark. It will provide you contact information for the department on campus that can assist with that specific task. The task list is personalized to you, so other students may have a different list.

There are three ways completed tasks are tracked:

- ♠ Automated Step: System will check off step when complete. Most of these steps will update automatically within 1-2 hours with a nice big check mark when complete. Others may take 24-48 business hours.
- ♦ Manual Step: After you have completed this step, mark as complete by clicking on the checkbox.
- Pending Step: This step will become available after you have completed all required prerequisite steps.



It may seem that there are a lot of tasks to complete, but it's important that you complete each one!
