# Development of USI

- 50<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of founding in 2015
- Southern Indiana Higher Education, Inc. (SIHE) purchased 1,400 acres of land in the mid 1960's and donated 300 acres to develop a branch campus of Indiana State University in Evansville
- SIHE developed student housing and gifted approximately \$30 million in housing to USI in the early 1990's
- SIHE dissolved in 2008 and gave the remaining 900 acres of land valued at \$3 million to the USI Foundation

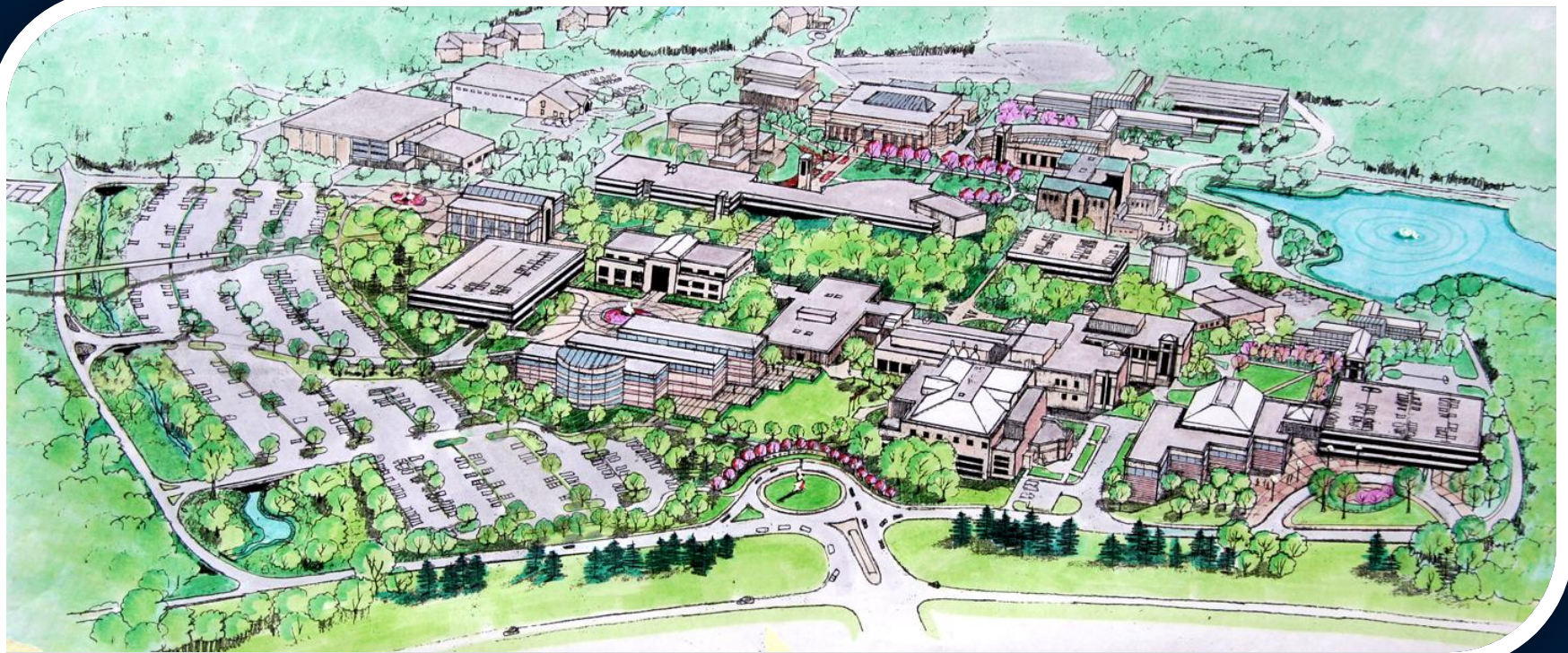

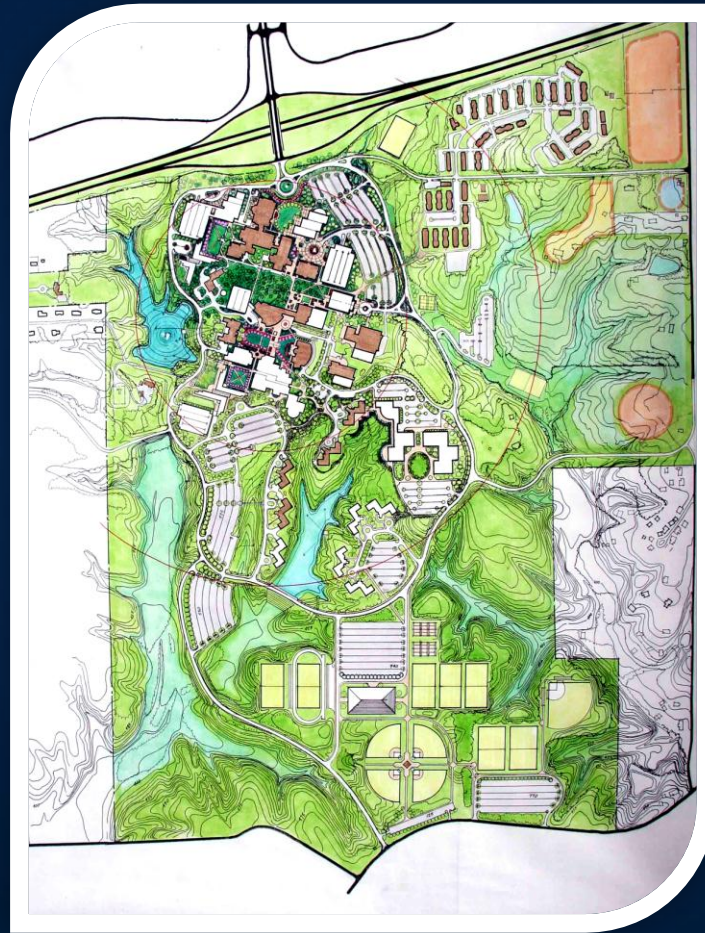

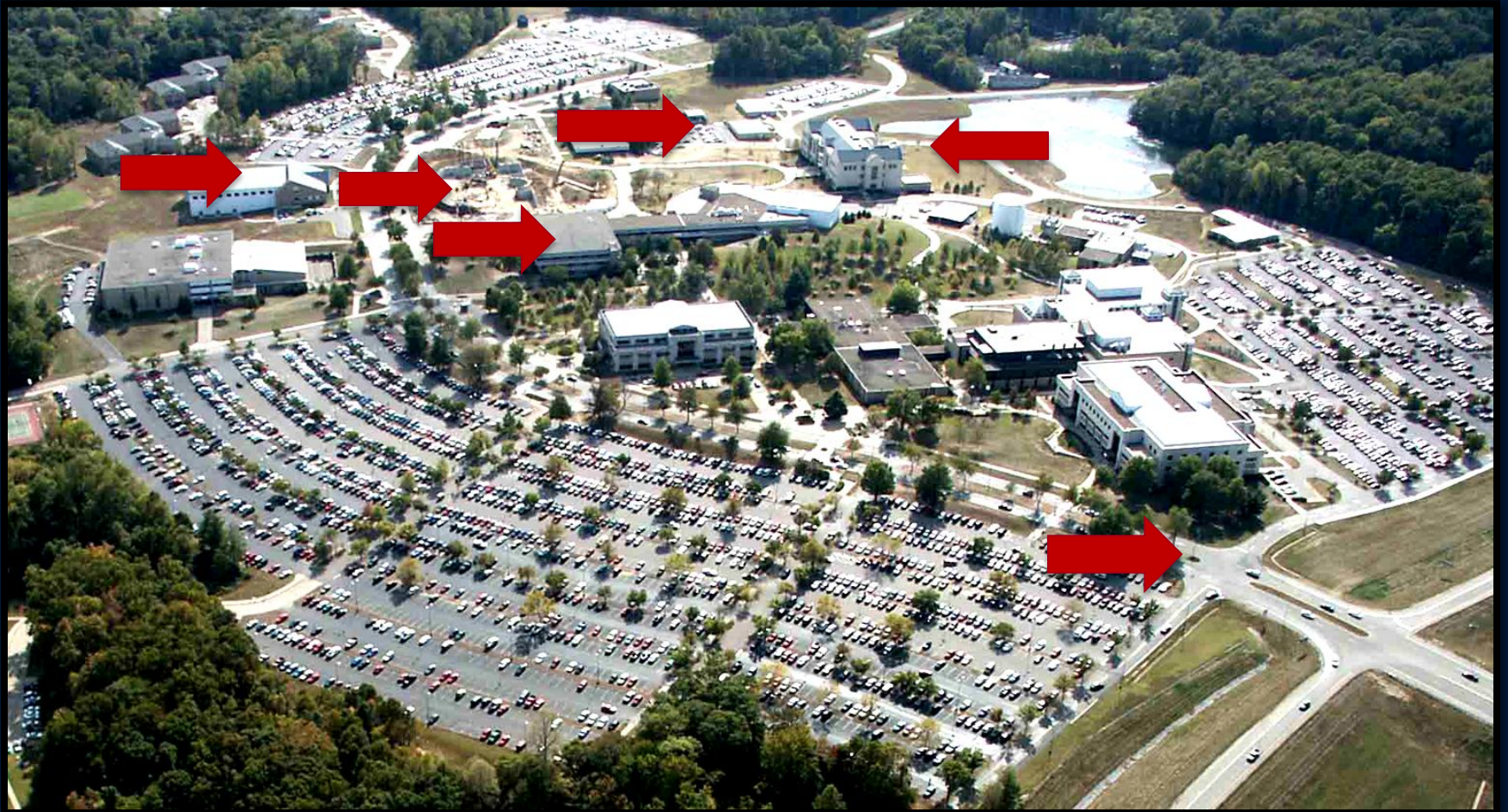
