Tenth Annual Shaw Biology Lecture

The 10th Annual Shaw Lecture will be held at 7 p.m. Wednesday, March 26, in Carter Hall. Pulitzer Prize-winning author Richard Rhodes will present a public lecture entitled *Robert Oppenheimer: the Man, the Making of the Atomic Bomb, and the Consequences.* A question/answer session and book signing will follow the lecture.

When asked about the origin of the lecture series, Dr. Marlene Shaw stated, "The annual lecture began with the desire to bring students in

contact with scholars of current, engaging, and thought-provoking topics. My 1991 Distinguished Professor Award presented opportunity and a path to legacy."

An endowment was established in the USI Foundation using the DPA as a seed for gifts from alumni, faculty, and friends. Biology alumnus Dr. Joey V. Barnett '81 was instrumental in securing generous contributions from peers. A USI Foundation Endowment, the USI Biology Department, and the Pott College of Science, Engineering and Education support the Shaw Biology Lecture.

By supporting visits of scholars whose expertise lies at the interface of biology and fields such as law, medicine, public health, agriculture, political science, ethics, and history, the annual lecture strives to enhance the academic environment for students, faculty, and the community-at-large. The intent is to invite speakers who touch persons both on campus and off.

Speakers are sought for expertise, reputation, and storytelling flair. Some held national or international status as science authors, go-to experts for TV newscasts and documentary films, authority on cutting-edge technology, and recognition as research scientists.

Topics have varied from the 21st century challenge of feeding 10 billion people throughout the world to emerging infectious diseases to breeding endangered species. With these lectures, the University invites the public into its academic space to learn, discuss, and reflect. The lectures are free and open to all.

Richard Rhodes is the author of 26 books including *The Making of the Atomic Bomb* which won a Pulitzer Prize in Nonfiction, and *Dark Sun: the Making of the Hydrogen Bomb*, which was shortlisted for a Pulitzer Prize in History. Rhodes is *author of John James Audubon: The Making of An American* and *Scientist E.O. Wilson: A Life in Nature.*

When selecting this year's speaker, Shaw remarked, "Since 2025 marks 80 years since the end of World War II, it was appropriate to reflect on this historical era that affected so many people in our community who served overseas and on the home front."
