Kevin J. Valadares Will Bring Commencement Address



Dr. Kevin J. Valadares

Dr. Kevin J. Valadares, associate professor of Health Services and Health Administration, will bring today's Commencement address. He received the 2009 Integra Bank Distinguished Professor Award. It is a University tradition for the recipient to deliver the fall Commencement address.

Dr. Valadares joined the faculty in 2001. He is the director of the undergraduate program in health services and the Master of Science in Health Administration program. He has been selected as one of five visiting professors to teach at Harlaxton College in Grantham, England, during his sabbatical in the spring semester. He will teach courses on issues and trends in healthcare systems, ethics, and bioethics.

An associate professor of health services and health administration, Dr. Valadares is continuing research into generational differences of physicians. He has studied a trend indicating that younger physicians are more interested in striking a balance between their personal and professional lives than physicians of older generations. While in England he will investigate whether the trend holds true among British primary physicians.

Dr. Valadares is one of the USI representatives who attended the Association of University Programs for Health Administration's annual meeting to support the health services program's self-study in a face-to-face panel review. The USI program was awarded certification, one among 41 of 175 undergraduate programs that have attained AUPHA certification.

He is a member of USI's strategic planning committee and has led the effort, through video reflections and directions by USI faculty and staff, to tell the USI story.

Active in the life of the University, he serves on faculty committees and sits on consulting boards for numerous community agencies including Seaton Hall, the Women's Hospital, St. Mary's Health System, and WNIN, the local public broadcasting station.

Through his teaching and research, he prepares students to work in today's changing healthcare environment. He is a leader in using technology to enhance student learning activities, with emphasis on responding to human need.

Dr. Valadares graduated with honors in two undergraduate programs at the University of Ottawa, and he holds a Master of Health Administration degree from St. Louis University. He earned a doctorate in healthcare ethics in 2003 from St. Louis University.

Commencement Traditions

Presidential Medallion

During the Middle Ages, medallions signified membership in religious orders and guilds; in the Renaissance, membership in elite orders of knighthood and prominence in government office. Today, colleges and universities strike medallions to commemorate important events and achievements. Donated by the late Melvin Denner, professor emeritus of biology, and Anne Denner, former instructor in nutrition and biology, and their family, this medallion was fabricated by Honorcraft for the 1995 inauguration of H. Ray Hoops. Dr. Denner served as grand marshal at the University's first inauguration.

The University of Southern Indiana Presidential medallion signifies the authority invested in the president. The medallion's obverse carries, at its center, a three-inch reproduction of the University seal and, surrounding the seal, a half-inch rim. On the reverse appear the names and dates of appointment for the University's presidents. The president wears this medallion for all formal academic ceremonies.

Gonfalons

Ceremonial flags called gonfalons originated in the Middle Ages for civil and military processions, often appearing beneath the steel head of a knight's lance. In Italy, gonfalons designated individual Italian republics; the chief magistrate or other high official served as gonfalonier carrying the banner.

At the University of Southern Indiana, gonfalons represent each major academic unit; typically deans or department heads act as gonfaloniers. Here gonfalon colors derive from traditional hues associated with each college's academic disciplines. Our commencement gonfalons come as a gift from the USI Bookstore.

University Seal

The University seal, designed by Nussmeier Engraving, bears the University's colors — red, white, and blue — with gold. The shield signifies the importance of higher education in defending citizens against ignorance. Between the two banners displaying the University's name appear a band and an open book bound together by the torch of knowledge. In the band, rays of light emanate simultaneously from a rising sun, symbolizing the young University, and from the torch, symbolizing the light of knowledge and the passion for scholarship. Trees on either side of the flame suggest not only the University's pastoral southern Indiana setting but also life, growth, and continuity.

Beneath this band, an open book emphasizes the importance of teaching and learning; academia populi and academia populo indicate that the University of Southern Indiana is a scholarly academy founded and supported by the people, for the people. Finally, the laurel branches to the right and left of the book represent victory: the light of learning overcomes the darkness of ignorance.

University Mace

In the Middle Ages, bodyguards of French and English monarchs carried ceremonial maces. Later, the mace became an important symbol of office in civil processions and academic pageantry. At the University of Southern Indiana, the grand marshal, a distinguished member of the faculty, carries the mace.

A replica of Richard Owen's walking cane serves as the staff for the University mace. A respected geologist and professor of natural science at Indiana University, Owen was the first president of Purdue University. He was a son of Robert Owen, the Welsh industrialist who

established New Harmony, Indiana, as a center for education and enlightened social reform in the early 1800s. The 32-inch-tall wooden cane was presented to Richard Owen in 1874; and through the generosity of his descendant, the late Kenneth D. Owen, that cane, lent to USI, served as the grand marshal's staff in all commencement exercises from 1985 to 1995.

Designed and fabricated by Nicholas Logsdon of Indianapolis, the goldplated mace bears at the top, above the cane's golden head, an open orb with a replica of the University seal. The orb's free-flowing design symbolizes interrelationships among all academic disciplines. Immediately below the cane's orb, three two-inch, golden rings bear the names and appointment dates of the University presidents. The names of Kenneth Dale Owen, Jane Blaffer Owen, and James A. Sanders, donors of the mace, appear on a finial near the bottom of the cane replica.

Designed and created by alumnus Kenny Fisher '77, the replica of the cane and its base are made of walnut from the Owen mansion built in New Harmony during the 1830s.

Academic Regalia

In the Middle Ages, many Europeans wore long, flowing robes and gowns. Royal decree dictated materials and colors appropriate for each station in society. As trade guilds developed, so did gowns distinctive to particular professions. Thus, when students in medieval universities organized into guilds, they donned long gowns and hoods which helped keep them warm in unheated buildings and cold garrets. Usually students were clerks, members of the minor clergy; they and their masters wore hoods to protect their shaved heads. Later, when students and masters began wearing skullcaps, these hoods became ornamental.

Commencement Traditions

In the Renaissance, churchmen adopted the stiff, square cap known as the biretta, with black for priests, purple for bishops, and red for cardinals. Such caps originated in the address of ordinary people and ranged from inflexible to pliant, from square to round; ultimately the biretta led to the familiar mortarboard first popularized at Oxford University. The tassel elaborates the tuft originally decorating the center of a round cap.

Throughout the growth of universities, designs for gowns, hoods, and caps became standard. Apprentices of the arts (bachelors), teachers (masters), and erudite teachers who completed post-graduate studies (doctors) wore differing gowns and hoods, with strict rules governing these variations. From 1754 until after the Civil War, American students and faculty wore gowns and caps daily on campus, in class. A formal system of academic costume in the United States resulted from a conference at Columbia University in 1895. Current customs remain substantially the same as those adopted in 1895 and standardized by the Intercollegiate Code of Academic Costume.

The basic color for all gowns is formal black although persons with associate degrees may wear gray gowns and caps and a few institutions allow robes in the university's colors. Associate and bachelor gowns have long, pointed, open sleeves. The bachelor's hood, seldom worn in the United States, is short with narrow, velvet edging in a color indicating the wearer's academic discipline and a satin lining in the granting institution's colors. In contrast, the master's gown has extremely long, closed sleeves from which the wearer's arms protrude at the elbows; and the lower part of the sleeves, ending in a tippet, dangles below the arms. Longer than the bachelor's hood, the master's hood has wide, velvet edging and exposes part of the satin lining. Bachelor and

master tassels are usually black, but may appear in a color indicating the academic discipline. The doctor's gown has bell-shaped sleeves and displays velvet down the front and on each sleeve's three crossbars; the velvet is black or a color signifying the wearer's academic discipline. Unlike the other academic hoods, the doctor's hood is characterized by great length, by wider velvet edging in a color representing the wearer's academic discipline, and by the full exposure of the satin lining in colors of the university which conferred the doctorate. The doctor's tassel is gold.

Hooding Ceremony

Academic hoods vary in length according to the degree attained and are lined with the colors of the institution by which the degree was granted. Hooding signifies the induction of the graduate into the fellowship of the academy, a welcoming gesture by those who represent the high standards of scholarship and creative achievement. During today's ceremony, master's degree candidates will receive hoods distinctive to their degrees.

Alumni Association Pins

Graduates in today's ceremony are receiving lapel pins with the University logo as a gift from the University of Southern Indiana Alumni Association.

Baccalaureate Scholarship Honors

The baccalaureate degree candidate graduating with the highest scholarship index is graduated summa cum laude. Baccalaureate students graduating with a scholarship index of 3.80 or higher are graduated magna cum laude. Those with a scholarship index between 3.60 and 3.80 are graduated cum laude. These achievements are set forth on the individual diplomas. Honor students can be recognized in the Commencement Exercises

by colored stoles and tassels. Gold indicates *summa cum laude*; red, *magna cum laude*; and blue, *cum laude*.

Because students enrolled in master's degree programs are expected to maintain a minimum grade-point average of 3.0, and most achieve much higher levels, scholarship honors at Commencement are given only to baccalaureate students.

University Honors Scholars

The designation of University Honors Scholar is awarded to students who successfully complete the Honors Program. They can be recognized in today's ceremony by the white honor cords worn with their regalia.

Photography During Ceremony

A commercial photographer is taking photographs of each graduate as he/she shakes hands on stage. Each graduate will receive a proof from which duplicates can be ordered. Family members who wish to take still or video photographs during the ceremony are asked to use the restricted area on the floor. Your cooperation ensures the dignity of the Commencement ceremony.

Commemorative DVD

In response to requests from graduates and families, a high quality commemorative DVD of today's ceremony is being produced by the USI Office of Instructional Technology Services in cooperation with the USI Alumni Association.
