- 1 Atheneum:** Registration/Admission/Museum Shop
  - 2 Oxen:** David Shamber from Step Back Farm demonstrates how to yoke his oxen, how they respond to commands and how they were used to help clear the land using forestry tools.
  - 3 Hide Tanning & Beekeeping:** Kevin Clinton gives hide tanning demonstrations and shows other primitive living skills. Becky Clinton demonstrates beekeeping and has honey available for purchase.
  - 4 Paper Marbling and Bookbinding:** John Bielik is an artisan, instructor and living history interpreter specializing in bookbinding and paper marbling.
  - 5 Native American Quill Art:** Djuana Tucker shows how to create porcupine quill embroidery in 18th century Eastern Woodland/Great Lakes style.
  - 6 Spinning and Natural Dyes:** Karen Whitt will demonstrate the art of spinning fibers and dyeing them using natural dyes.
  - 7 Fur Trader:** Tony Gerard depicts a French Indian fur trader of the 1800s showing his goods, hides and furs.
  - 8 Wool Hat Making & Flax Processing:** Robert and Cindie Etienne demonstrate how to process flax and make wool hats.
  - 9 Basket Weaving:** Beth Lovin shows the art of weaving baskets.
  - 10 Blacksmith:** John Lovin demonstrates traditional metal working.
  - 11 Harmonist Garden:** Patty Beagle shows what kinds of plants were grown in a typical Harmonist garden.
  - 12 West Street Gate (Admission)**
  - 13 Candle Dipping:** People in the early 1800s made candles from animal fat in a hand-dipped process.
  - 14 Kettlecorn For Sale:** Stop by for an old-fashioned treat.
  - 15 Naturalist Drawing:** Savannah Hoskinson demonstrates natural history illustration.
  - 16 Robert Owen Presentation:** Historian and storyteller Brian "Fox" Ellis gives a first-person reenactment of Robert Owen, one of New Harmony's founders who traveled from Scotland to establish a community based on education and equality. Must preregister.
  - 17 Harmonist Chores & Kids' Dances:** Kelley Morgan shows students what chores they would have been doing if they were members of the Harmonist Community. Taylor Blaylock demonstrates historic children's dances.
  - 18 1800s Diorama and Kids' Games:** Visit the Salomon Wolf House for kids' games and a detailed diorama of the town of New Harmony.
-  **Tree of 40 Fruits:** Through the process of grafting, each tree grows over 40 different types of fruit.
-  **Local businesses on Main Street** have treats available for purchase including Capers Candy & Cards and Fire & Ice.
