Responsibilities

- Submit events and content to online community and tourism calendars.
- Create social media posts and help with planning the social media calendar.
- Research potential collaborations with community partners.
- Design marketing and outreach materials.
- Prepare program packets and presentation and workshop materials.
- Assist with research and creation of samples of hands-on activities for education programs.
- Assist with events and programs as needed.
- Complete special projects and reports as requested.

Qualifications

- Willingness to learn and work in a team environment; handle multiple tasks at once; adhere to deadlines.
- Great organizational skills, patience, and strong attention to detail.
- Excellent verbal and written communication skills.
- Knowledge of social media platforms; graphic design skills are a plus, but not required.
- Intern must be available to work at least 10 hours per week in New Harmony, Indiana.
- Open to college undergraduates, recent graduates, or graduate students with an interest in history, art history, museums, or fine arts. Other majors are welcome to apply, but please indicate in your cover letter how this internship relates to your degree or career goals.
