

- 1. Using Google Chrome, Log in to my.usi.edu

- 2. Once you log into my.usi.edu, click on the Tk20 icon from the list of icons
 - Note: There are some known errors that occur if you have multiple windows/tabs open, so when you get beyond this step, please close out of any unused windows or tabs.



3. Once you log into Tk20 homepage, look at the upper right-hand corner. Click on your name. Your role is listed under your name. Click on the small down arrow to see if you have more than one role in Tk20. If you have more than one role, click on the "**Faculty**" role

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Scoring Core Curriculum Assignments in Tk20 Common Questions for Scoring Key Assignments

- 1. When I open Tk20 to score the student work, the list of students doesn't match my current class roster.
 - The class lists for Core 39 assessment are created earlier in the semester; once they are created, they can't be changed. This means that some students who dropped the class may still appear on the roster; see the scoring instructions sent to you by your CCAF to see what do about these students. In very rare cases, if a student joined the class after the rosters were set, the student's name will not appear on your class list. If either of these cases happen to you, don't worry these won't skew your data.
- 2. What if a student did not submit the assignment?
 - We always assume that some students may not complete the assignment. This will not skew your data.
- 3. What are the due dates for the Core 39 Assessment?
 - For on-campus faculty, the assignment must be administered by the end of finals, and they must be scored by the date when final grades are due. CAP instructors have an extended deadline because the high school and USI calendars do not coincide. However, we request that the scores be entered as soon as possible before the end of your academic semester.
- 4. Am I required to submit my students' work as part of assessment?
 - YES. Please collect work from all of them in digital format and email them to your USI Core Curriculum liaison. These are collected and stored on our secure servers; they will be deleted after USI's next accreditation review. The only people who might look at the student work would be USI's accreditors.
- 5. Who sees the results of this assessment?
 - After the data is correlated by USI's Office of Planning, Research, and Assessment, individual data sheets for each teacher will be generated that show their students' performance and offer comparisons to the performance of all students who were assessed on these criteria during this same semester. This data is only sent to the teacher, since it's an assessment of the students' mastery of key skills, not an assessment of the faculty member. Individual class data for CAP instructors is not provided to school administrators.
