- Teaching Practice abstracts (up to 500 words) also highlight how your proposed presentation relates to student learning or academic success, along with lessons learned or challenges. References/resources recommended.
- **SoTL abstracts** (up to 500 words) also highlight how your proposed presentation relates to student learning or academic success. It also should describe why the work is relevant, what was done, and the takeaways/lessons learned. SoTL abstracts should include: research question/context, grounding, approach/methods, and discussion/lessons learned. References are expected.

Please submit your abstract by uploading it as a file (pdf or docx format).

- Include the **presentation title** at the top of the document.
- Do not include the names of the presenters/authors since proposals are reviewed double-blind (with the names of the presenter and reviewers hidden).
