Upon completion of the sophomore year, a student meeting admission criteria (a minimum cumulative high school GPA of 3.0/4.0) may enroll at the University of Southern Indiana with approval from the high school guidance counselor and the student's parents. **High School Agreement students are not eligible for financial assistance and pay current tuition and fee rates at the time of enrollment.** The bill for tuition will be applied to your account and can be viewed via MyUSI. The bill must be paid in full by the end of the semester in which you receive the USI grade, or the payment will be considered delinquent. Students who have outstanding fee balances cannot receive transcripts or enroll in USI courses.

To search available courses, visit bulletin.usi.edu. Select the class schedule for the term you plan to enroll from the drop down box in the upper right corner. Then, select "Class List" from the menu on the left side of the screen. Students who wish to enroll in a course in Mathematics or Foreign Language must take a placement test prior to enrolling in a class in either subject area. Placement tests can be arranged by contacting Academic Skills located in the Education Center on the USI campus.

Required application materials include (1) the high school transcript, (2) the high school agreement form and (3) \$40 non-refundable application fee. Applicants who have been schooled in settings other than a commissioned high school and who apply for the High School Agreement Program also must submit scores from either the SAT or ACT nationally standardized testing programs. The final decision on all High School Agreement applicants will be made by Undergraduate Admissions:

If a student has been admitted as a freshman for the upcoming fall semester, an additional high school transcript and application fee is not required to participate in this program.

Regular admission to the University of Southern Indiana is not guaranteed for students who participate in the High School Agreement program. Students planning to attend USI upon graduation should formally apply for Undergraduate Admission.

While enrolled in USI's High School Agreement program, students are expected to abide by the academic rules of behavior befitting a university student. Notice to Students

- It is important that you understand the effort you will be expected to put forth in college courses, as well as the policies, procedures and consequences which apply to college enrollment. - Students who are not admitted to the High School Agreement Program but who are
 judged by their high school officials to be academically motivated and to have a strong
 potential for success in college courses may be reconsidered on an individual basis.
 Such students must submit a personal letter of appeal and at least one letter of support
 from a recommending school official. Appeals should be sent to the address indicated
 above.
- After a student is admitted into the High School Agreement Program, he or she will receive instructions regarding how to go through the enrollment process.
