South Bend Business, Education, Civic Leader Will Bring Address

Ernestine Morris Raclin, a South Bend leader in business, education, and civic affairs who has been called "Indiana's First Lady of Banking," will bring the 1988 Commencement Address. Mrs. Raclin also is being honored by conferral of an honorary Doctor of Laws degree in recognition of her contributions to education, business, and community on local, state, and national levels.



Mrs. Raclin is chairman of the Board of 1st Source Corporation and 1st Source Bank in South Bend, the largest banking concern in northeast Indiana and southwest Michigan. She has headed the bank for 10 years. Mrs. Raclin also is a director of First Chicago Corporation, First National Bank of Chicago, and the Northern Indiana Public Service Company of Hammond, Indiana.

A graduate of South Bend schools and Ward Belmont School in Nashville, Briarcliff College in New York, and St. Mary's College at Notre Dame, her contributions to education in recent years include leadership at all levels in both private and public schools. Mrs. Raclin is a trustee of the University of Notre Dame, where she is cochairman of its \$150-million fund drive; trustee of Converse College in Spartanburg, South Carolina; life trustee and president emeritus of the board of The Stanley Clark School of South Bend, a private elementary school; director of Associated Colleges of Indiana; and a member of the Advisory Board of Indiana University-South Bend.

Mrs. Raclin's civic activities reflect her interest in shaping the quality of life not only in her community, but also in her state. She has sought to enhance economic development through her work with the Chamber of Commerce, Indiana Growth and Opportunity Council, Indiana Economic Development Council, Hoosiers for Economic Development Committee, and in economic development activity for South Bend, Mishawaka, and St. Joseph County.

Governor Robert D. Orr has appointed Mrs. Raclin to the Governor's Citizens Advisory Committee for Title XX, the Merit Selection Committee on Federal Judicial Appointments, and the Governor's Fiscal Policy Advisory Council. Mrs. Raclin also has been involved with the YWCA, First Presbyterian Church, Housing Allowance Office, Michiana Public Broadcasting Corporation, United Way of Indiana and America, Junior Achievement of South Bend, 1987 International Summer Special Olympics, Community Education Roundtable of St. Joseph County, and the Junior League.

The extent of Mrs. Raclin's participation is reflected in her numerous honors, including honorary Doctor of Law degrees from the University of Notre Dame, Converse College, Indiana State University, and Vincennes University. She also has received the E. M. Morris Award from IU-South Bend, St. Mary's College Community Service Award, Ivy Tech's Excellence in Education Award, Indiana Public Broadcasting's Edmund F. Ball Award, the 1987 Castaldi Award for United Way top volunteer in Indiana, and 1987 Hospice of St. Joseph County Helping Hands Award. Mrs. Raclin is a member of the Indiana Academy and was made an honorary member in 1980 of Beta Sigma Gamma at the University of Notre Dame.

Associate of Science in Social Science Elizabeth Mahon Gustafson Dr. Arthur Bestor Recognized For New Harmony Scholarship



Dr. Arthur Bestor, emeritus professor of history at the University of Washington, is being honored by conferral of the Doctor of Letters degree in recognition of his pioneering scholarship on New Harmony, Indiana.

Dr. Bestor began his research at the Workingmen's Institute Library in New Harmony in the mid-1940s, work that turned his attention from Fourierism, his doctoral dissertation topic, to Owenism. His New Harmony research provided much of the material for his classic study of American communalism, Backwoods Utopias, The Sectarian and Owenite Phases of Communitarian Socialism in America: 1668-1829, first published in 1950. Among Dr. Bestor's numerous books was the 1948 publication of Education and Reform at New Harmony and Correspondence of William Maclure and Marie Fretageot.

During his early research visits, Dr. Bestor organized the archives at the Institute Library which, as Indiana's oldest surviving public library, celebrates its sesquicentennial this year. The Workingmen's Institute was one of 144 in Indiana and 16 in Illinois founded by Robert Owen's partner, William Maclure, in the manner of the later Carnegie libraries.

Dr. Bestor is known for his work on the progressive education of New Harmony. He also has done extended research and writing over the years on education in American schools and on the framing of the U. S. Constitution and the intent of the framers, particularly with regard to foreign policy. A native of New York, Dr. Bestor holds a Ph.D. from Yale University, a master's degree from Oxford University, and an honorary LL.D. from Lincoln University. He was professor of history at the University of Washington from 1962 until his retirement in 1976, and has held active memberships in numerous professional organizations.



Donald B. Cox Honored For Achievements In University Development

Mr. Donald B. Cox, Evansville Realtor and business, civic, and political leader is being honored with conferral of the Doctor of Laws degree in recognition of his leading role in and continuing support for the development of the University of Southern Indiana as Indiana's sixth state university.

Mr. Cox was chairman of the fundraising campaign for the University Home and has been an active member of the Board of Directors of the USI Foundation. As a close friend and advisor to Governor Robert D. Orr, he was active in the legislative and administrative process that led to USI being established as a separate state university in July, 1985.

Mr. Cox gives leadership to numerous professional organizations. In Evansville, he also is chairman of the board of Pro-Eco, Inc.; president of Mid Continent Insurance Agency, Inc.; a director of National City Bank; director and vice chairman of Welborn Baptist Hospital Board; director, executive committee member, and vice chairman for governmental affairs of the Chamber of Commerce; and a former member of the Metropolitan Evansville Progress Committee.

Mr. Cox was Vanderburgh County Republican chairman from 1972 to 1977 and has remained involved with organizations and campaigns on local, state, and national levels. He was named by his peers in the Evansville business, civic, and political community as the most influential and effective Evansville Republican. Mr. Cox was elected Republican National Committeeman in 1984 and was appointed in 1982 by the Governor as one of three members of the State Election Board.

Mr. Cox's honors include being named a Sagamore of the Wabash by both Governor Orr and former Governor Otis Bowen and listed in Marquis' Who's Who in Finance and Industry (1981-82 and 1983-84), Who's Who in the Midwest (1982-83), and Who's Who in the World (1982-83).

Academic Dress

The academic costume dates from medieval days when university students wore woolen and fur garments for warmth in damp and drafty buildings. Most of those studying were clerics in the holy orders; they wore a cloak to which was attached a hood that could be pulled up to cover their tonsured heads. Simplified today, the costume serves to remind us that its wearer is a member of an ancient and venerable profession; it also indicates by its color and design its wearer's degree and its institution by which the degree was conferred.

In the United States, black has been the traditional color for academic gowns, but some institutions authorize holders of their doctorates to wear colors of the institution. The bachelor's gown is distinguished by its long, open sleeves; the master's by its closed, slitted sleeves; the doctor's by its full sleeves trimmed with bands of velvet, which may be black or a color denoting the field in which the degree was taken.

The mortarboard cap, proper for all degrees, is black. Tassels, usually black, are worn over the left front quarter of the cap. Holders of the doctorate may wear tassels

of gold thread.

Academic hoods vary in length according to the degree and are lined with the colors of the institution by which the degree was granted. The honorary doctoral hoods of the University of Southern Indiana are black, lined with blue satin with red satin chevrons. They are edged with white velvet.

The Mace of the University

In medieval England, the mace was a formidable weapon, held ready by a bodyguard who led the way for dignitaries or officers of the court. From the sixteenth century in England and since colonial days in America, the mace has become a symbol of office only, and is carried by a distinguished member of the faculty who leads the Commencement processional. Here, it is carried by the Grand Marshal.

The University's official Mace is the cane of Richard Owen, who was a geologist and professor of natural science at Indiana University before becoming the first president of Purdue University. A respected scientist and scholar, Richard was a son of Robert Owen, the Scottish industrialist who established New Harmony, Indiana, as a center for education and enlightened social reform in the early 1800s. All the children of Robert Owen who accompanied him to America made far-reaching contributions to society, and helped to shape the governmental, social, and cultural directions of the state, region, and nation.

Scholarship Honors

The student graduating with the highest scholarship index will be graduated summa cum laude. Students graduating with a scholarship index of 3.80 or higher will be graduated magna cum laude. Those with a scholarship index between 3.60 and 3.80 will be graduated cum laude. These achievements are set forth on the individual diplomas. Honor students can be recognized in the commencement exercises by the colored stoles and tassels. Gold indicates summa cum laude; red, magna cum laude; and blue, cum laude.

The honor stoles and tassels are furnished by the USI Bookstore.
