MAJOR ADAM W. BALBACH TO DELIVER COMMENCEMENT ADDRESS



Major Adam Balbach '07 M'19



The speaker for the Graduate Studies Ceremony is Major Adam Balbach, who earned a Bachelor of Science in Finance in 2007 and a Master of Business Administration–Human Resources in 2019. He is an Active Duty Officer in the Indiana Army National Guard and has served his state and nation for two decades.

Balbach began his military career as an enlisted Forward Observer in 2004 and was commissioned as an Infantry Officer in 2007 through the University of Southern Indiana ROTC program. Notable assignments include Rifle Platoon Leader, Mortar Platoon Leader, Commander of Company A, 1st Battalion 151st Infantry in Linton, Indiana, and deployment in support of Operation Joint Guardian to Kosovo from 2022–23.

Balbach has completed military education, including the Command and General Staff Officer Course, Maneuver Captains Career Course and Infantry Officer Basic Course. His military awards and decorations include the Meritorious Service Medal (with Oak Leaf Cluster), the Army Commendation Medal (with four Oak Leaf Clusters), the Army Achievement Medal, the Armed Forces Expeditionary Medal, the NATO Medal for Balkans Operations and the Indiana Commendation Medal. He is also Air Assault and Army Pathfinder qualified.

Currently, Balbach is the Division Human Resources Officer for the Indiana Army National Guard's 38th Infantry Division in Indianapolis, where he supervises personnel services for more than 8,000 soldiers. With nearly 20 years of leadership experience managing diverse teams in fast-paced, high-stress environments, he is accomplished in driving impactful decisionmaking, strategic HR planning and data-driven talent management. He maintains interactive reporting and tracking systems leveraging data mining to identify trends and inform leadership decisions, significantly enhancing both retention and readiness across the organization.

Previously, he served as the Executive Officer for the 1st Squadron 152nd Cavalry Regiment in New Albany, Indiana, where he supervised operations across personnel, intelligence, logistics and communications for more than 450 soldiers. His experience and analytical expertise informed senior leader decision-making and strategic planning, resulting in measurable improvements in organizational performance.

Additionally, Balbach served as the Brigade Human Resources Officer for the 219th Engineer Brigade and the 76th Infantry Brigade Combat Team from 2019–23 in Franklin and Indianapolis. In these roles, he managed all HR functions for more than 4,000 personnel. He was the lead officer for administratively and medically preparing more than 500 soldiers across eight states for overseas deployment and oversaw pay, evaluation, promotion and awards actions for 1,100-plus multinational personnel deployed in austere, international environments.

Balbach is passionate about empowering teams, improving processes and fostering organizational excellence. His proven ability to enhance retention and readiness through innovative policies and performance metrics has made him a highly respected leader in strategic human resources.

Today, he resides in Chandler, Indiana, with his wife, Krista, and three boys, Hank, Jase and Luke. He is a father, husband, soldier, coach and mentor. His family, faith and service to the community motivate him to be better every day.

DR. DANIEL D. KING TO DELIVER COMMENCEMENT ADDRESS



Dr. Daniel King '10



The speaker for the Kinney College of Nursing and Health Professions Ceremony is Dr. Daniel King, a 2010 Bachelor of Science in Nursing graduate. He also holds a Master of Nurse Anesthesia from the Mayo Clinic College of Medicine and Science and a Doctor of Nursing Practice from The University of Alabama, where he was honored as a Centennial Scholar for his outstanding contributions to the nursing profession.

Currently serving as an Associate Professor in the Doctor of Nursing Practice, Nurse Anesthesia Program at Rosalind Franklin University of Medicine and Science in North Chicago, Illinois, King is dedicated to advancing nursing education and preparing future leaders in the field. Alongside his academic role, he is a Certified Registered Nurse Anesthetist (CRNA) and the owner of DreamLion Anesthesia, a business he founded to provide high-quality anesthesia services. He also serves as an elected Director for the American Association of Nurse Anesthesiology (AANA), where his leadership is instrumental in shaping national policies and promoting professional development.

In addition to this, King has held influential leadership positions, including serving on the Board of Directors for the Illinois Association of Nurse Anesthesiology. He has also served as the Chair of the AANA Professional Practice Division and led the Continued Professional Certification Assessment Practice Panel for the National Board of Certification and Recertification for Nurse Anesthetists. His leadership has contributed to the development of national practice guidelines and efforts to ensure ongoing professional growth and excellence within healthcare.

King's research focuses on interdisciplinary healthcare, perioperative risk assessment and health equity. He is particularly recognized for his pioneering work in cannabis use assessment and stigma reduction, which led to the development of the Cannabis Use and Behavioral Assessment Tool. His research has reshaped discussions on perioperative care and health equity, and his scholarly contributions include more than 100 peer-reviewed publications, practice documents and presentations.

As a dedicated mentor, King has guided numerous doctoral students and supported dozens of scholarly projects. He advocates for national initiatives addressing multimodal pain management and collaborative approaches to improving health outcomes for all.

During his time at USI, King excelled both academically and in campus life, earning an Academic Excellence Award and serving as a USI Cheerleader. Today, he remains deeply committed to inspiring the next generation of healthcare professionals. His dedication to innovation, leadership and advancing global healthcare continues to make a lasting impact in both academic and clinical communities.

Joel Tshite '19



The speaker for the Pott College of Science, Engineering, and Education Ceremony is Joel Tshite, a 2019 Bachelor of Science in Engineering graduate. He is an accomplished Connectivity Engineer with extensive expertise in the design, deployment and management of mission-critical network infrastructure across hyperscale data centers and telecommunication environments. His work has driven the success of complex IT infrastructure and structured cabling initiatives for some of the world's largest technology firms, including Meta and Oracle.

Currently, Tshite serves as a Senior Data Center Build Engineer for Oracle Cloud Infrastructure in Chicago, Illinois. In this role, he provides technical leadership for white space infrastructure fit-outs within more than 15 data center facilities totaling over 150 megawatts of critical capacity. As the primary technical point of contact for structured cabling, Tshite directs the design, installation and integration of fiber and copper networks, ensuring optimal performance, efficiency and scalability in support of Oracle's cloud operations. He also oversees vendor management, quality assurance inspections and as-built documentation, ensuring strict adherence to Oracle's standards and industry best practices.

Prior to joining Oracle, Tshite was a Connectivity Engineer at Meta's hyperscale data center campus in Virginia, where he led the technical deployment of more than 15,000 server racks across a 90-megawatt operational region. His responsibilities included overseeing QA/QC for inside plant cabling, network infrastructure expansion projects, equipment upgrades and change management processes. His attention to detail and leadership helped enhance the performance and reliability of Meta's global data center network, contributing to the seamless delivery of services to billions of users worldwide.

Tshite's career began as an Outside Plant Design Engineer for Q Services, where he planned and designed fiber optic networks for Metronet. He was responsible for creating GIS-based fiber layouts and splice locations, permitting, and ensuring compliance with construction standards and local regulations.

Beyond his professional career, Tshite is deeply committed to community impact and philanthropy. He serves on the TWEENS Advisory Board, where he provides consultancy guidance on strategy to scale the organization's impact sustainably in the Tongogara refugee camp. He has led TWEENS' fundraising efforts for the past four years, helping secure resources to expand educational and development programs that empower young refugees.

Additionally, Tshite is the Communications Chair for the USI International Alumni Council, where he drives fundraising strategies and initiatives aimed at supporting USI's International Students Success Fund. Through his leadership, he works to expand opportunities for students, ensuring they have the financial and academic support necessary to thrive.

Throughout his career, Tshite has demonstrated an unwavering commitment to advancing connectivity solutions that power digital transformation and innovation. His technical acumen spans network topology design, structured cabling, disaster recovery, redundancy planning and IT infrastructure integration. He is also passionate about mentoring teams, driving crossfunctional collaboration and ensuring continuous improvement in data center operations.

His contributions to the field of connectivity engineering underscore his dedication to building resilient, high-performance infrastructure that enables the rapid evolution of technology and supports the demands of modern digital ecosystems. Simultaneously, his philanthropic endeavors reflect his deep commitment to creating lasting social impact through education, technology and community development.

In addition to her entrepreneurial ventures, Vaught is an active advocate and community leader in Evansville. She has served as a board member for the Downtown Economic Improvement District and as Secretary and Commissioner for the Evansville Redevelopment Commission, managing tax increment financing for various redevelopment districts. Vaught was the lead advocate for the Sunset Skatepark—Indiana's largest concrete skatepark. She helped fundraise over \$1 million for the project while designing and overseeing its construction. Her passion for enhancing public spaces reflects her deep commitment to improving the quality of life for Evansville residents.

She is also a Certified Public Accountant and a 2006 graduate of the Graduate School of Banking at the University of Colorado, Boulder.

Currently serving as President and Chief Executive Officer of First Bank, headquartered in Carmi, Illinois, Roser leads a community-focused financial institution dedicated to serving Southern Illinois and Southern Indiana. In this role, she provides strategic leadership to ensure the bank's long-term sustainability and growth. Her responsibilities include setting the organization's vision, cultivating shareholder relationships, leading all board activities for both the bank and its holding company and developing succession plans for the executive leadership team and board of directors.

In parallel, Roser serves on several boards and committees, reflecting her commitment to community and industry advancement. She is a member of the Board of Directors for First Bank, Ferrell Hospital, Pekin Insurance and the Absher Charitable Foundation. Additionally, she contributes her expertise as a member of the Community Bankers Association of Illinois Innovation Committee and serves on the Community Depository Institutions Advisory Council for the Federal Reserve Bank of St. Louis. These roles underscore her dedication to strengthening community banking and supporting regional economic development.

Roser's professional journey at First Bank spans over two decades. Prior to her appointment as President and CEO in 2019, she held several leadership roles, including Executive Vice President, Chief Operating Officer, Chief Financial Officer, and earlier in her career, Internal Auditor and Compliance Officer. Throughout her tenure, she has played an instrumental role in driving innovation, ensuring regulatory compliance and fostering a culture of integrity and excellence within the organization.

Beyond her academic and professional accomplishments, Roser is deeply invested in the well-being of her community. USI BESTOWS TWO HONORARY DEGREES FOR

This weekend's honorary degree recipients are celebrated in the University of Southern Indiana community for their continued dedication to higher education. The recipients are credited for actively shaping their communities and have made significant contributions to the arts and sciences at USI and beyond.

Dr. Ronald S. Rochon, former USI President, and Mrs. Lynn W. Rochon, former First Lady, are being awarded honorary Doctor of Laws degrees for their 14 years of dedication and service to the University.

Dr. Rochon became the fourth President of the University of Southern Indiana in July 2018, and served until July 2024, which followed eight years as the University's Provost. His leadership significantly transformed USI, securing over \$445 million in state funding for capital projects and operations. His strategic vision drove remarkable growth in the Indiana Commission for Higher Education's performance funding metrics, including

overall degree completion, at-risk degree completion, STEM degree completion, student persistence and on-time graduation rates.

A champion for student success, Dr. Rochon led USI's transition from NCAA Division II to Division I athletics, elevating the University's profile and competitive spirit. He also implemented the institution's third Strategic Plan, *Accelerating Impact*, which prioritizes student achievement, engagement, institutional reputation and financial sustainability. His career has been dedicated to fostering educational excellence, equity and access. As an educator, he taught extensively on the history of American education, culturally responsive teaching and leadership in higher education. His work focused on supporting diverse learners in underserved schools and communities. During his tenure as provost, Dr. Rochon played a pivotal role in revamping the University Core Curriculum and UNIV 101 seminar course. He also led the approval process for USI's second doctoral program in educational leadership and worked with faculty to develop new programs for undergraduate, graduate and online learners. His commitment to higher education extended beyond USI, having served on numerous boards, including as past chairs of the Board of Directors for the Association for State Colleges and Universities and the Board of Directors for the Community Anti-Drug Coalitions of America, as well as Board Chair for the American Association of Colleges for Teacher Education.

While at USI, Mrs. Rochon was a steadfast advocate for student well-being, creating an inclusive and nurturing environment on campus. With warmth and dedication, she mentored and supported students, ensuring they felt heard, valued and empowered. She played a vital role in fostering a culture of belonging at USI, connecting students with resources and championing initiatives that promote respect, inclusion and opportunity.

Before coming to USI, Mrs. Rochon served as Education Program Coordinator at the Community Health Center of Buffalo, where she worked to improve healthcare access and education for underinsured populations. A passionate educator, she volunteered in schools across multiple states and mentored girls through the YWCA. Her commitment to education extends globallyshe and Dr. Rochon support a rural school in Ghana, providing essential resources to underserved students.

Beyond their professional achievements, while at USI, the Rochons were deeply engaged in civic leadership. Dr. Rochon served on the board of WNIN Public Broadcasting, Deaconess Health System and was appointed to a two-year term on Indiana Governor Eric Holcomb's Workforce Cabinet. Mrs. Rochon was recognized for her work in community advocacy and student mentorship.

Both South Side Chicago natives, Dr. Rochon earned his bachelor's degree from Tuskegee University and master's and doctoral degrees from the University of Illinois at Urbana-Champaign. He currently serves as the President of California State University, Fullerton. Mrs. Rochon holds a bachelor's in marketing from the University of Illinois at Chicago and a master's in inner-city studies from Northeastern Illinois University.

Of all their accomplishments, they are most proud of their family—son Ayinde and daughter Nia—who inspire their lifelong commitment to education, leadership and service.

Honorary degrees are awarded for distinguished and extraordinary service consistent with the mission of the University. That service may be to the University itself, and/or to local, statewide, national or international communities. Individuals selected to receive an honorary degree exemplify the highest ideals of integrity, service and dedication to learning.

Candidate applications for honorary degrees from the University of Southern Indiana are reviewed by a committee defined by the honorary degree award policy. Recommendations are submitted to the President for approval by the USI Board of Trustees. Such a degree is the highest form of recognition granted by USI.

MAXWELL T. STOLL TO RECEIVE PRESIDENT'S MEDAL

Axwell Stoll, who will graduate *magna cum laude* with a bachelor's degree in biology and a minor in psychology, has been named the recipient of the prestigious President's Medal, the highest honor bestowed upon an undergraduate in the University of Southern Indiana Class of 2025.

Stoll has exemplified integrity, professionalism and maturity throughout his academic, research and extracurricular pursuits. A committed leader in the Student Ambassadors Organization (SAO), he has fostered a positive and inclusive environment, earning the trust and respect of peers, faculty and staff. Known for his humility and curiosity, Stoll regularly seeks feedback and demonstrates a desire for continuous self-improvement.

Over four years with SAO, Stoll accumulated more than 150 volunteer hours, playing a key role in sustaining USI's vibrant campus community. As Activities Chair during his sophomore and junior years, he planned retreats and banquets for more than 60 members, strengthening the sense of community. In his final year, Stoll served as SAO President, inspiring his team through servant leadership and a commitment to student engagement. His leadership expanded SAO programming, increasing student participation and promoting inclusivity and service.

Stoll's impact at USI extends beyond his involvement in student organizations. Early in his academic career, he impressed several professors with his enthusiasm for research and his ability to critically evaluate information and integrate concepts. His passion for biology grew quickly, leading him to work in the genetics lab as a student worker for Dr. Kim Delaney during his freshman year. There, he learned the delicate nature of science, where every small detail and measurement matters.

Eager to deepen his involvement, Stoll approached Dr. Alex Champagne, who took him on as a research assistant. He contributed to projects on lipid membranes in various organisms, learning that some problems require fresh perspectives to solve. The result of his research was a successful grant proposal he wrote on cellular lipids in tropical and temperate birds, earning an Endeavor! Student Research Award. His ability to communicate his research clearly and confidently impressed peers and mentors. Stoll continues his research while actively encouraging others to explore similar opportunities, presenting to organizations like the Biology Club and Pre-Professional

Health Club. Inspiring others to pursue research is as rewarding to him as conducting his own.

At the 2024 Indiana Physiological Society meeting, Stoll earned second place in the Undergraduate Poster category. His calm, confident demeanor left a lasting impression on both students and senior scientists. His ability to explain complex concepts in an engaging manner points to a promising future in medicine, where these skills will serve him well. As Stoll continues his research journey, he remains committed to inspiring others and making meaningful contributions to the scientific community.

In addition to his academic and research achievements, Stoll was named the 2025 Distinguished Biology Graduate, received the Distinguished Sophomore Award in Fall 2022, the Koewler Scholarship and named a Top 10 Student Leader in 2021-22. He has been a member of the USI Honors Program, USI Foundation Student Advisory Board, President of the Pre-Professional Health Club and Co-president of the Pott College Student Advisory Board. His commitment to service includes volunteering at the Evansville Rescue Mission and St. James Catholic Church. On campus, he served as a Welcome Week Leader and Student Ambassador, earning Student Ambassador of the Month in 2022.

University of Southern Indiana



S teven J. Bridges, a two-time alumnus of the University of Southern Indiana, was appointed the University's fifth President on April 2, 2025, after serving as the Interim President since July 2024. As the first USI graduate to hold this position, Bridges brings a deep connection and dedication to the University he has long served. Bridges began his career at USI in 1989 and has served in multiple leadership roles, including Vice President for Finance and Administration since 2015.

One of Bridges' quotes following his appointment was, "I was the type of student for which this campus was founded 60 years ago, and I feel a great responsibility to continue the extraordinary education I received, for our students of today and tomorrow."

From its initial stages of planning in the early 1960s, community leaders have supported the University by providing a solid base for its present success and future growth. The University has continued to uphold its mission under the strong leadership of its first four presidents, David L. Rice, H. Ray Hoops, Linda L. M. Bennett, Ronald S. Rochon, and now, President Steven J. Bridges.

The University of Southern Indiana was established on September 15, 1965, in the old Centennial School Building, offering classes to 412 students. In 1967 Southern Indiana Higher Education, Inc. (SIHE) raised nearly \$1 million to acquire the land where the campus now sits. The University moved to its present site four miles west of the city limits of Evansville in September 1969. The University graduated its first class of baccalaureate degree students in 1971 and achieved initial North Central Association accreditation in 1974.

USI Today

USI enrolls nearly 9,500 dual credit, undergraduate and graduate students in more than 130 areas of study. A public higher education institution located on a beautiful 1,400-acre campus, USI offers programs through the Romain College of Business, College of Liberal Arts, Kinney College of Nursing and Health Professions, Pott College of Science, Engineering, and Education and the School of Graduate Studies.

The Kinney College of Nursing and Health Professions also offers classes at the Stone Family Center for Health

Sciences in downtown Evansville. The University offers study-abroad opportunities in many countries and is host to international students from around the globe.

USI is a two-time Carnegie Foundation Community Engaged University and offers programs and services to more than 15,000 participants annually through Outreach and Engagement. Programs and services include the Center for Applied Research, College Achievement Program, Community Engagement, Historic New Harmony, Historic Southern Indiana, New Harmony Gallery of Contemporary Art, Corporate Partnerships and Customized Training, Lifelong Learning Noncredit Programs, ROTC, Safety Training, Service Learning, Southern Indiana Japanese School and the Veteran, Military and Family Resource Center.

A competitive member of NCAA Division I and the Ohio Valley Conference, USI offers 19 varsity intercollegiate men's and women's sports.

Under the leadership of President Bridges, the University continues a tradition of affordable excellence through innovation and engagement, and positions itself as a top choice for high-caliber college students across the state, nationally and internationally.

The University of Southern Indiana's vision states: USI will be a recognized leader in higher education boldly shaping the future and transforming the lives of our students through exceptional learning and intentional innovation.

Its mission statement is: USI is an engaged learning community committed to exceptional education. We exist to provide an educated citizenry that can engage in a civil manner within a community with divergent ideas and cultural differences. We prepare our students to lead and make positive contributions to our state, their communities, and to be lifetime learners in a diverse and global society.

USI is engaged in its 2021–26 strategic plan, Accelerating Impact, which includes four overarching goals: improve student success, foster impactful engagement, elevate visibility and reputation and strengthen financial viability.

These four goals, along with the core values of integrity, exceptional education, transformative learning, inclusive and diverse community and external engagement, are a roadmap for the University's future.

Today, more than 54,000 alumni have been awarded diplomas from the University of Southern Indiana. USI graduates are renowned surgeons, bank executives, artists, leaders in K-12 education, accounting executives, lawyers, nurses, hospital administrators, college professors, elected officials, just to name a few, and through the knowledge gained from here—USI, their alma mater—they ignite transformation in their communities.

Presidential Medallion

During the Middle Ages, medallions signified membership in religious orders and guilds; in the Renaissance, membership in elite orders of knighthood and prominence in government office. Today, colleges and universities strike medallions to commemorate important events and achievements. The University of Southern Indiana Presidential Medallion signifies the authority bestowed upon the president.

Donated by the late Melvin Denner, Professor Emeritus of Biology, and Anne Denner, former Instructor in nutrition and biology, and their family, a medallion was fabricated by Honorcraft for the 1995 inauguration of USI President H. Ray Hoops. Dr. Denner served as grand marshal at the University's first inauguration.

For former President Rochon's inauguration a new medallion was struck with the updated University Seal and a new chain was fabricated. In addition to the names of USI's presidents on the reverse side of the medallion, the new chain was commissioned bearing their names on four separate plates. Made by Medalcraft Mint, Inc., the medallion and chain were underwritten by a generous gift from University trustee and alumnus, Ronald D. Romain '73 and alumna Connie Dartt Romain '74.

During the Pott College Ceremony, a replica of the Presidential Medallion will be presented to Maxwell T. Stoll '25. This is the highest honor given to a graduating senior.

Gonfalons

Ceremonial flags called gonfalons originated in the Middle Ages for civil and military processions, often appearing beneath the steel head of a knight's lance. In Italy, gonfalons designated individual Italian republics; the chief magistrate or other high official served as gonfalonier, carrying the banner.

At the University of Southern Indiana, gonfalons represent each major academic unit; academic deans serve as gonfaloniers. First used in 2005 and presented to the University as a gift from the Campus Store, new gonfalons were needed and fabricated for the 2019 Inauguration Ceremony of Dr. Rochon.

University Seal

The University Seal, originally designed by Nussmeier Engraving and updated in 2018, bears the University's colors—blue, red and white—with gray. The shield signifies the importance of higher education in defending citizens against ignorance. Between the two banners displaying the University's name appears an open book, illuminated by the torch of knowledge. Trees on either side of the flame suggest not only the University's pastoral Southern Indiana setting but also life, growth and continuity.

The open book emphasizes the importance of teaching and learning; *academia populi* and *academia populo* indicate that the University of Southern Indiana is a scholarly academy founded and supported by the motto *education by the people, education for the people.* Finally, the laurel branches to the right and left of the book represent victory: the light of learning overcomes the darkness of ignorance.

University Mace

In the Middle Ages, bodyguards of French and English monarchs carried ceremonial maces. Later, the mace became an important symbol of office in civil processions and academic pageantry. At the University of Southern Indiana, the grand marshal, a distinguished member of the faculty, carries the mace.

A replica of Richard Owen's walking cane serves as the staff for the University Mace. A respected geologist and professor of natural science at Indiana University, Owen was the first president of Purdue University. He was a son of Robert Owen, the Welsh industrialist who established New Harmony, Indiana, as a center for education and enlightened social reform in the early 1800s. The 32inch tall wooden cane was presented to Richard Owen in 1874. Through the generosity of his descendant, the late Kenneth D. Owen, that cane, lent to USI, served as the grand marshal's staff in all Commencement exercises from 1985 to 1995.

Designed and fabricated by Nicholas Logsdon of Indianapolis, the gold-plated mace bears at the top, above the cane's golden head, an open orb with a replica of the University Seal.

The orb's free-flowing design symbolizes interrelationships among all academic disciplines. Immediately below the cane's orb, three two-inch, golden rings bear the names and appointment dates of the University presidents. The names of Kenneth Dale Owen, Jane Blaffer Owen and James A. Sanders, donors of the mace, appear on a finial near the bottom of the cane replica.

Designed and created by alumnus Kenny Fisher '77, the replica of the cane and its base are made of walnut from the Owen mansion built in New Harmony during the 1830s.

Academic Regalia

The academic garb dates from medieval days when university students wore woolen and fur garments for warmth in damp and drafty buildings. Most of those studying were clerics in holy orders; they wore a cloak to which was attached a hood that could be pulled up to cover their tonsured heads.

Simplified today, the garb serves to remind us that its wearer is a member of an ancient and venerable profession; it also indicates, by its color and design, the wearer's degree and the institution by which the degree was conferred.

In the United States, black has been the traditional color for academic gowns, but some institutions authorize holders of their doctorates to wear colors of the institution. The bachelor's gown is distinguished by its long, open sleeves; the master's by its closed, slitted sleeves; the doctoral by its full sleeves trimmed with bands of velvet, which may be black or a color denoting the field in which the degree was taken.

The mortarboard cap, proper for all degrees, is black. Tassels, usually black, are worn over the left front quarter of the cap. Holders of the doctorate may wear tassels of gold thread.

Academic hoods vary in length according to the degree attained and are lined with the colors of the institution by which the degree was granted. Hooding signifies the induction of the graduate into the fellowship of the academy, a welcoming gesture by those who represent the high standards of scholarship and creative achievement.

Doctoral and master's degree candidates will receive hoods distinctive to their degrees. The honorary doctoral hoods of the University of Southern Indiana are black, lined with blue satin with red satin chevrons. They are edged with white velvet. Retired members of the University faculty can be recognized in today's ceremony by the red, white and blue cords or a replica of the Presidential Medallion with a blue ribbon worn with their regalia.

The Distinguished Professor Award is the highest recognition bestowed upon a faculty member at the University of Southern Indiana. Faculty who have received this award can be recognized in today's ceremony by the blue and red stole embroidered with the University Seal worn with their regalia.

Baccalaureate Scholarship Honors

The baccalaureate degree candidate graduating with either a 4.0 or the highest grade point average graduates *summa cum laude*. Baccalaureate students with a grade point average of

3.80 or higher graduate *magna cum laude*. Those with grade point averages between 3.60 and 3.79 graduate *cum laude*. These achievements are set forth on the individual diplomas. Honor students can be recognized in the Commencement exercises by colored stoles and tassels. Gold indicates *summa cum laude*; red, *magna cum laude*; and blue, *cum laude*.

Because students enrolled in doctoral and master's degree programs are expected to maintain a minimum grade point average of 3.0, and most achieve much higher levels, scholarship honors at Commencement are given only to baccalaureate students.

University Honors Scholars

The designation of University Honors Scholar is awarded to students who successfully complete the Honors Program. They can be recognized in the Commencement ceremony by the white honor cords worn with their regalia.

Alumni Pins

Graduates in each ceremony are receiving alumni lapel pins with the University logo as a gift from the University of Southern Indiana Alumni Council.
